

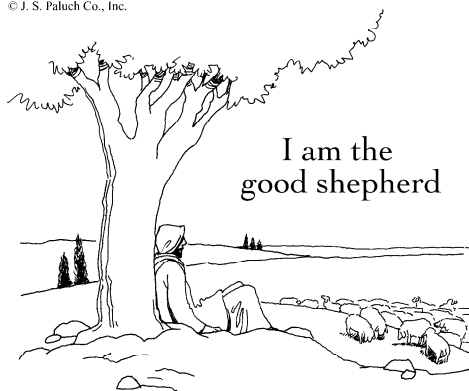
# Saint Bruno Church

**Namaste**

*Namaste* is a common Indian greeting. When spoken it is the equivalent of "greetings" or "good day to you." It is often accompanied by a slight bow made with hands pressed together, palms touching and fingers pointed upward, and in front of the chest. The gesture *Namaste* represents the belief that there is a divine spark in each one of us. When you do a *Namaste* you are in effect saying, "The spirit in me respects the spirit in you." It is fully in accord with Christian teaching.

I belong to a priest support group of one Chinese, three Filipinos and three Indians. We used to meet every month for dinner, prayer and personal sharing. Due to other concerns we have fallen out of the practice but lately have taken it up again. Yesterday, our gathering was hosted by Fr. Javier at his place, the Church of the Assumption in Tomales. It's a scenic drive to the place and the church sits on the brow of a hill overlooking the valley. What a lovely and quiet place! We had dinner of pasta, baked oysters and roasted beef. Then we talked deep into the night, sharing personal stories, all done in the spirit of *Namaste*.

I was visiting with priests friends in New York two weeks ago. We bought tickets for *Ghost* and while waiting for the show, we went to TGIF for dinner. Our server was a young lady named Nicole. She was so attentive and charming that we made sure we spoke well of her to the manager. Asked why she was so cheerful, she answered, "Life is short. Why get mad?" Those are words can only be spoken in the spirit of *Namaste*.

The following day we drove up to Newport, Rhode Island and went for drinks at a pub in Bowen's Wharf. Again, we were fortunate to have a very pleasant server named Amanda. She scrawled in our chit "Thank you, gentlemen!" and sketched a smiley. *Namaste!*

In the spirit of *Namaste*, let's not overlook basic courtesy. Say "please" when you ask for something. Be grateful. Say "thank you" for a favor or service done to you no matter how small or trivial it is. Return a call and reply to a letter in a timely manner. If you fail to show up for an appointment, apologize and say "sorry." Let everything be done in the recognition of the divine spark that lies in the heart of every person. *Namaste!*

**Namaste**

*Namaste* es un saludo indio común. Cuando se habla es el equivalente de "saludos" o "buen día." A menudo es acompañada por un ligero arco hecho con las manos juntas, tocando las palmas y los dedos apuntando hacia arriba, y en la parte frontal del pecho. El gesto de *Namaste* representa la creencia de que hay una chispa divina en cada uno de nosotros. Cuando haces un *Namaste* estás diciendo, "El espíritu en mí respeta el espíritu en ti." Es totalmente de acuerdo con la doctrina cristiana.

Yo pertenezco a un grupo de apoyo de sacerdotes conformado por un chino, tres filipinos y tres indios. Nos reuníamos todos los meses a cenar, hacer oración e intercambiar ideas. Debido a nuestras ocupaciones ya no lo habías hecho, pero últimamente lo hemos retomado. Ayer, nuestro encuentro fue organizado por el padre Javier en la Iglesia de la Asunción en Tomales. Se trata de un recorrido panorámico en el lugar y la iglesia se sienta en un cerrito que domina el valle. ¡Qué lugar tan encantador y tranquilo! Tuvimos una cena con pasta, ostiones al horno y carne asada. Luego hablamos bien entrada la noche, compartiendo historias personales, todos ellos realizados en el espíritu de *Namaste*.

Estuve de visita con sus amigos sacerdotes en Nueva York hace dos semanas. Compramos entradas para el *Ghost* y mientras esperábamos el show, nos fuimos a TGIF a cenar. Nuestra mesera era una joven llamada Nicole. Fue muy atenta que nos aseguramos de que hablamos bien de ella con el gerente. Al preguntarle por qué estaba tan alegre, ella respondió: "La vida es corta. ¿Por qué se enojan?" Esas son las palabras sólo se puede hablar en el espíritu de *Namaste*.

Al día siguiente nos fuimos a Newport, Rhode Island a tomar una copa en un pub del Muelle de Bowen. Una vez más, tuvimos la suerte de tener una mesera muy agradable llamada Amanda. Ella nos dijo "Gracias, señores!" Y dibujó una carita sonriente. *Namaste!*

En el espíritu de *Namaste*, no lo pasemos por alto la cortesía básica. Di "por favor" cuando pidas algo. Se agradecido. Di "gracias" por un favor o servicio hecho a ti, no importa cuán pequeño o insignificante que sea. Devolver una llamada y la respuesta a una carta de una manera oportuna. Si no se presenta a una cita, pedir disculpas y decir "lo siento". Que todo sea hecho en el reconocimiento de la chispa divina que está en el corazón de cada persona. *Namaste!*

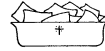
