**NINTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME**

Many people do not make a distinction between what is illegal or forbidden by the law and what is immoral or sinful before God. Harboring an immigrant without papers is illegal but may not be immoral. On the other hand, abortion is legal in many countries but this does not make it morally justifiable. Jesus was more interested in the morality of actions before their legality and so should we. His teaching and example obliges us to sometimes take a critical look at the civil and religious laws to see whether they are in accordance with sound moral principles and to challenge them when we find that they are not. This is what Jesus does in today's gospel.

In today's gospel we see Jesus challenging the laws of Sabbath observance that were in force in the religious establishment of his time. The Pharisees saw the action of Jesus' disciples, plucking ears of corn as they walked through the cornfield, as breaking the law of Sabbath observance. But Jesus defends them, saying that "The sabbath was made for people, and not people for the sabbath" (Mark 2:27). In the synagogue there was a man with a withered hand. The Pharisees were watching Jesus to see whether he would cure the sick man on the Sabbath day, an action which they saw as breaking the Sabbath. Jesus fearlessly went on to cure the sick man, after silencing his opponents with the question, "Is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to kill?" (Mark 3:4). Mark tell us that at this point Jesus was boiling with anger at their hardness of heart.

This being the only place in the Gospels where the word "anger" is attributed to Jesus, we might pause and ask ourselves what it was that made Jesus so angry. I think the anger of Jesus had less to do with the fact that these people were after his life and more to do with the fact that these religious leaders were so insensitivity to human suffering and need while claiming that they were only defending and protecting the integrity of God's commandment.

The morality of Jesus differs from the legalism of the Pharisees in that whereas the Pharisees gave priority to defending and protecting the integrity of God's law as they understood it, Jesus gave priority to defending and protecting the integrity of the suffering human person created in God's image and likeness. We will do well to take seriously the principle which Jesus enunciates in today gospel since it applies not only to the Sabbath law but to many others laws as well: "The sabbath was made for people, and not people for the sabbath."

NOVENO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Muchas personas no hacen distinción entre lo que es ilegal o prohibido por la ley y lo que es inmoral o pecaminoso ante Dios. Albergar a un inmigrante sin papeles es ilegal, pero no puede ser inmoral. Por otro lado, el aborto es legal en muchos países, pero esto no significa que sea moralmente justificable. Jesús estaba más interesado en la moralidad de las acciones antes de su legalidad y por lo que debería. Su enseñanza y su ejemplo nos obliga a tomar a veces una mirada crítica a las leyes civiles y religiosas para ver si están en conformidad con los principios morales y desafiarlas cuando nos encontramos con que no lo son. Esto es lo que hace Jesús en el evangelio de hoy

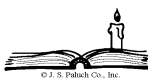
En el evangelio de hoy vemos a Jesús desafiando las leyes de la observancia del Sábado que estaban en vigor en el establecimiento religioso de su tiempo. Los fariseos, al ver la acción de los discípulos de Jesús, arrancando espigas de trigo, mientras caminaban por el campo de maíz, como quebrantar la ley de la observancia del Sábado. Pero Jesús los defiende, diciendo que "El Sábado fue hecho para la gente, y no las personas para el Sábado" (Marcos 2:27). En la sinagoga había un hombre con una mano seca. Los fariseos estaban esperando a Jesús para ver si curaba al enfermo en el día de reposo, una acción que ellos veían como la violación del Sábado. Jesús, sin miedo fue a curar al enfermo, después de silenciar a sus oponentes con la pregunta: "¿Es lícito hacer el bien o hacer mal en Sábado, para salvar una vida o matar?" (Marcos 3:4). Marcos nos dice que en este punto Jesús estaba hirviendo de ira por la dureza de corazón.

Siendo este el único lugar en los Evangelios, donde se atribuye la palabra "rabia" a Jesús, que podría hacer una pausa y preguntarnos qué fue lo que causo que Jesús se sintiera tan enojado. Creo que el enojo de Jesús tenía menos que ver con el hecho de que estas personas fueron después de que su vida y más que ver con el hecho de que estos líderes religiosos eran tan falta de sensibilidad ante el sufrimiento humano y la necesidad de tiempo que afirma que sólo estaban defendiendo y protegiendo la integridad del mandamiento de Dios.

La moral de Jesús se diferencia del legalismo de los fariseos en que, mientras que los fariseos le dio prioridad a la defensa y protección de la integridad de la ley de Dios como ellos lo entendían, Jesús le dio prioridad a la defensa y protección de la integridad de la persona que sufre humana creada a imagen de Dios y semejanza. Haremos bien en tomar en serio el principio que Jesús enuncia en el evangelio de hoy, ya que se aplica no sólo a la ley del sábado, pero a las leyes de muchos otros, así: ". El sábado fue hecho para la gente, y no las personas para el sábado"

Long Time Parishioners

Aurora Sarmiento came to St. Bruno Church in 1974, where she and her husband Ben raised their three children. At that time, the priests were all purely English speaking as were the majority of the parishioners. There were no lay ministers. Aurora remembers Father Burke beginning the creation of communities after he became pastor in 1984. One day he asked her to coordinate the masses. When she expressed doubts about her ability to do this, he told her "I'll be with you." This was to her like a promise from God. Aurora was one of the first to cook and sell Filipino food at the Festival. She coordinated the noon Mass for about ten years and was in charge of overall liturgy for about five years. Now Aurora serves as a lector, an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, a part time receptionist for the office, and is currently a member of the Finance Council, the Liturgy Committee, and the Centennial Committee. Aurora is the ultimate volunteer and will do most anything asked of her in service of the church. We honor Aurora Sarmiento and her family as long time parishioners.

History Corner

In the 21st century, St. Bruno Church is a melting pot reflecting the true nature of the population of the United States comprised of immigrants from all over the world. In the beginning of the 20th century, the immigrants were mainly what you would call the English speaking community of those from Great Britain, Ireland, and Italy. Just look at the names. In 1907 Mercy Silva, Joseph Huff, Albert Coturri, J.J. Jones, Edith Martinelli, George Edwards, J.J. Smith, J.J. Maloney, and Mrs. J. Valentine formed a committee to raise funds for the formation of a Parish. The Silva family donated the 50 foot lot on the corner of San Bruno and Hensley Avenues. Today we have large Tongan, Filipino, and Hispanic communities at St. Bruno Church giving a unique flavor of many cultures to our Parish of St. Bruno's. As those early new parishioners gave much of their time, talents, and funds to the formation of the Parish of St. Bruno's, our communities today do the same to keep our Parish vibrant and vital.
