**Corpus Christi**

Today is the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally known as Corpus Christi. This feast, like Trinity Sunday, does not celebrate a particular event in the life of Jesus. Instead it celebrates the Body & Blood of Christ which are really, truly and genuinely present in the Eucharist. This feast is usually celebrated with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Eucharistic procession.

The body of Christ is the reason why we go to Sunday mass. Many go because it's an obligation. Still others say that Jesus commanded it, so we obey and so we should. But why would Jesus keep asking us to do something that is often tedious and which many feel is unfruitful? Why drag ourselves out of bed early on Sunday morning to go to a church and be with people to whom we feel no attachment? Why can't we just belong to a virtual Christian community pretty much like we belong to a Facebook or a YouTube group? Because we go to church to receive the gift of the Body of Christ and so we must be bodily present. Blogs and websites are fine but they cannot substitute for our bodily gathering in the same way that videophone conferencing can be the basis of marriage.

When we receive the body of Christ at communion, we ourselves are transformed and become the Body of Christ. Thus, we go to church because we are the body of Christ. We constitute a community. When we gather together physically in one particular place and time, we truly form a church. We are an *ekklesia*. We are Catholics not just because we believe but because we belong. The more that we come together, interact with each other, greet each other as we enter the church, rub shoulders in the pews, put our offerings in the collection basket, shake hands during the exchange of peace and receive together communion, we grow as a community. The deeper is our bond and the better we recognize ourselves as the Body of Christ.

We are the Body of Christ ready to be broken and to be given. At the Eucharistic Prayer we remember how on the night before he died, Jesus took bread, blessed it and gave it to his disciples saying, "This is my body, given for you." Faced with failure, violence and death, Jesus spoke of hope and love. Thus we who receive him when faced with similar dreadful circumstances in our lives must be like Jesus, someone who embodies hope and love. As at the end of the mass we are sent on our way with the words, "Go in peace glorifying the Lord by your lives." We are the signs of God's love for the world. We are the Body of Christ.

**Corpus Cristi**

Hoy es la fiesta del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo, tradicionalmente conocida como Corpus Cristi. Esta fiesta, como la Santísima Trinidad, no celebra un evento en particular en la vida de Jesús. En su lugar se celebra el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo, que están verdadera, real y verdaderamente presente en la Eucaristía. Esta fiesta se celebra con la exposición del Santísimo Sacramento y procesión eucarística.

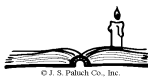
El cuerpo de Cristo es la razón por la cual nos vamos a la misa del Domingo. Muchos van porque es una obligación. Todavía otros dicen que Jesús lo mandó, así que debemos de obedecer. Pero ¿por qué Jesús sigue preguntando a hacer algo que a menudo es aburrido y que muchos sienten que es estéril? ¿Por qué nos arrastra de la cama temprano en la mañana del Domingo para ir a una iglesia y estar con gente a la que nos sentimos sin apego? ¿Por qué no podemos simplemente pertenecer a una comunidad virtual cristiana más o menos como nosotros pertenecemos a un grupo de Facebook o YouTube? Porque vamos a la iglesia para recibir el don del Cuerpo de Cristo y lo que debemos estar presente corporalmente. Blogs y sitios web están bien, pero no puede sustituir a nuestra reunión del cuerpo de la misma manera que la conferencia de videoconferencia puede ser la base del matrimonio.

Cuando recibimos el cuerpo de Cristo en la comunión, nos se transforman y se convierten en el Cuerpo de Cristo. Por lo tanto, vamos a la iglesia, porque somos el cuerpo de Cristo. Constituimos una comunidad. Cuando nos reunimos físicamente en un lugar y tiempo, realmente formar una iglesia. Somos una *ekklesia*. Somos católicos no sólo porque creemos, sino porque pertenecemos. Cuanto más nos reunimos, interactúan entre sí, se saludan al entrar en la iglesia, se codean en los bancos, ponemos nuestras ofertas en la canasta de la colecta, se dan la mano durante el intercambio de la paz y reciben la comunión juntos, crecemos como una comunidad. Cuanto más profundo es nuestro compromiso y mejor nos reconocemos como el Cuerpo de Cristo.

Somos el Cuerpo de Cristo, listos para ser roto y dado. En la Plegaria Eucarística recordamos cómo en la noche antes de morir, Jesús tomó pan, lo bendijo y lo dio a sus discípulos diciendo: "Esto es mi cuerpo, entregado por vosotros." Ante el fracaso, la violencia y la muerte, Jesús habló de esperanza y el amor. Por lo tanto somos nosotros los que lo reciben cuando se enfrentan a similares circunstancias terribles en nuestras vidas debe ser como Jesús, alguien que encarna la esperanza y el amor. Como en el final de la misa nos envió a nuestra manera con las palabras: "Vete en paz glorificando al Señor con nuestra vida." Nosotros somos los signos del amor de Dios para el mundo. Somos el Cuerpo de Cristo.

## Long Time Parishioners

**Woody Crabtree** and his family moved to San Bruno in 1957 when he was a child. He remembers going to CCD at St. Bruno's in 1960-1961, and he fondly remembers playing basketball in the main parking lot where there were two baskets at opposite corners. He vividly remembers the Irish priest Father Thomas who was pastor in the 1970's and who baptized his oldest daughter Barbara in 1973. He used to walk to the church from the family house on Pepper Drive, up the hill. In 1985, Marianne Brown asked Woody to usher the 4:30 Mass. This became a permanent position in 1987. Woody is the last usher of the original group of ushers which included Joe Welch, Bill Johnson, Gene McLaughlin, and Gene Wilson. He was head of the Usher's Group for a number of years, and now remains head usher of the 4:30 p.m. Saturday Mass, and helps at the 8 a.m. Sunday Mass and special celebrations when he can. Woody and his wife Dolores had their 40<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary blessed at the 8 a.m. Mass in May of this year by Father Michael. Father Burke blessed their 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary as well. We are pleased to honor Woody Crabtree as a long time parishioner.

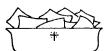

## History Corner

We had a number of pastors at St. Bruno's in late 20<sup>th</sup> century. The pastor with the most longevity and impact in that time period was Father Ronald A. Burke. Father Burke was the co-pastor from 1981-1984. He became the pastor of St. Bruno's in 1984 and served until his retirement in 1997. Father Burke was responsible for St. Bruno Church remaining open when it was originally scheduled to be closed in 1994. The parish hall was built and blessed by Archbishop John R. Quinn on August 23, 1997. The rectory was also rebuilt under his direction. He was responsible for convincing authorities to redirect the placement of the BART parking lot away from the neighborhood of parishioners living east of what is now called The Shops at Tanforan. He was responsible for the beginning of Perpetual Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in St. Anne's Chapel. He also started the Homeless Shelter at St. Bruno's which is run by Catholic Worker Hospitality House. Father Burke also led the formation of small church communities. Father Burke was truly a dynamic leader and a force in the growth of St. Bruno Church in every respect. He died June 19, 2010.
