## REFLECTIONS/ REFLECCIONES

### Nativity of John the Baptist

#### Hold the Locusts

The birth of John is much like the birth of Jesus. Neither mother expected to conceive Elizabeth was very old, Mary was not married. Both pregnancies were announced by an angel. Both children were given a name by the angel (Luke 1:13 and 1:31). All who heard about the births were amazed (Luke 1:66 and 2:18). It should be no surprise that the two mothers got together to discuss these things (Luke 1:39-56.) Most likely, talking about their experiences helped them to believe what the angel had said. You might say that Elizabeth prepared Mary to become the mother of the Savior. Years later John would help the people prepare to accept Jesus as their Savior. The Church has always taught that saints are not just to be admired, they are to be imitated. So how do we imitate John? Probably not by living in the desert and eating locusts and wild honey (I'll take the honey, but hold the locusts). Let's look at a few of the things John is known for and how we can learn from them.

John lived in the desert to prepare for his ministry. How do we prepare to serve the Lord? Have you ever gone on a retreat, not just because it was required by your school or job, but because you wanted to take time to be with the Lord? Many retreat houses have weekend programs for those who can't take off work. The point of a retreat is not just to get away, but to learn how to pray or to deepen your prayer life.

As we learn to pray better, we get to know the Lord better. That brings us to the second way to imitate John--lead others to Christ. We need to know the Lord in order to bring others to him. With the power of the Holy Spirit we received in the sacrament of confirmation, we can give good examples of Christian love, share our faith, stand up for justice, and encourage others to grow in faith also. ### Natividad de San Juan Bautista

#### SERÁ LLAMADO JUAN

Tendríamos que pensar que las personas del pueblo de Isabel y Zacarías no entendían lo que pasaba. "Le preguntaron por señas al padre cómo quería que se llamara el niño" (Lucas 1:62). En ningún lado dice que Zacarías estaba sordo por el castigo, sólo mudo. ¡Supuestamente podía oír! En todo caso, este es el pueblo al cual fue enviado el gran espíritu, Juan, para predicar un bautismo de conversión, con el fin de prepararlo para recibir al Mesías de Dios. Después de todos los siglos que transcurrieron entre la promesa a Abraham y Sara hasta el nacimiento de Juan, el pueblo a veces estaba cerca y a veces lejos de Dios, y este parece haber sido uno de los momentos en los cuales estaba alejado.

En la lectura de Isaías se habla de Juan, el más grande de los profetas, como "luz de las naciones" (Isaías 49:6). Yavé lo "formó . . . desde el seno materno, para que fuera su servidor", para devolverle el pueblo al Señor (Isaías 49:5). No sólo debía devolver el pueblo de Israel a Dios, sino que también predicar a todos los pueblos y anunciar la buena nueva a los que estaban alejados. Al dirigir al pueblo hacia Jesús y no hacia él, Juan proclama su mensaje a los "descendientes de Abraham, y cuantos temen a Dios" (Hch 13:26). En otras palabras, todos participaremos de la salvación de Cristo.

#### LA MANO DEL SEÑOR ESTABA CON ÉL

Sin duda, Juan era una persona extraordinaria. A medida que "se iba desarrollando físicamente su espíritu se iba fortaleciendo" (Lucas 1:80), y "la mano de Dios estaba con él" (Lucas 1:66). Esto repite las palabras de Lucas sobre Jesús. "El niño crecía y se desarrollaba lleno de sabiduría, y la gracia de Dios permanecía con él" (Lucas 2:40). Dios envió a Juan para que su "salvación llegue hasta los últimos rincones de la tierra" (Isaías 49:6). No solo los hijos de Abraham y Sara, sino que también todas las personas pueden regocijarse del poder salvador de nuestro Dios.

## History Corner

St. Bruno Church was a mission of the parish of St. Catherine's in Burlingame from 1907 until 1912. Finally in 1912, one hundred years ago, the St. Bruno Parish was established with Father William J. Cantwell as the first pastor. It is very hard to imagine in 2012, but in 1912 the city of San Bruno was still without lights, a water system, sewers, or paved streets. In an effort to push for the modernization of San Bruno, Father Cantwell wrote a letter to the editor in the "Peninsula News". Father Cantwell's letter eventually helped start a campaign towards incorporation of San Bruno. The incorporation was finally accomplished in 1915. The tradition of helping the city of San Bruno had been a part of St. Bruno Church throughout its history. It began with Father Cantwell and the drive for incorporation. Father Burke continued with the work to save the 5<sup>th</sup> Edition neighborhood from BART expansion. We continue today with the Homeless Shelter and community outreach from groups like St. Vincent de Paul.
