**FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME****DOCTRINAL MESSAGE**

Called from all eternity. Called from nothingness to being, called to enter the graced existence of children of God, called to be apostles of that same grace – this is the reality of each one of us here present. And those calls – successive in logic and in our awareness, perhaps, but in fact inseparably joined in God's eternal plan – find their justification exclusively in his act of pure love. When we were not, he loved us so that we might be.

Called "in Christ". Christ is the pattern of everything, even from the first moment of creation. Some scientists and philosophers of science, in recent decades, have referred to what they call "the entropic principle". By this they mean that matter was so constituted from the very time of the "big bang" that it almost appears to be designed so that human life could be possible. It appears that as little as half a degree difference in the initial temperature at creation would have made our world impossible. In actual fact, as Christians we know that God did design the universe for man ("God created everything for man", CCC 358; cf. 299); but further still, he created everything in, through and for Christ. All creation somehow reflects him; it is all marked by grace, which is "Christiform"; "I see his blood upon the rose and in the stars the glory of his eyes", an Irish poet who wrote. Above all, he is the prototype of what it is to be human and a child of God. The person whose life moves within an atmosphere of faith begins to realize that everything leads ultimately to him and to sharing his life.

Reluctant messengers. Amos (First Reading) rejects being labeled as a prophet because, at the time of his call, a professional guild of self-appointed "prophets" had given prophecy a bad name. "I'm not one of those", he wants understood. "The only reason I'm speaking for God is because 'he made me do it'". Every vocation has this aspect: it is not our choice. God calls. And while he leaves us free to accept or reject the call, the man or woman who has understood who God is knows only one answer makes sense.

What the prophet has to say is not his own; in the final analysis, whether or not he is extraordinarily bright, or well-read, or wise, or experienced, or eloquent, has no bearing. His words represent the mind of God (in human terms, of course) to his people, and it is on this account that they merit credence. What the apostle has to give others is not his own either, but a gift given him by Christ. Or rather, Christ himself is the gift the apostle, as bearer of his word and his healing grace, offers to every town and village.

DECIMOQUINTO DOMINGO ORDINARIO**MENSAJE DOCTRINAL**

Llamado desde toda la eternidad. Llamado de la nada a ser, llamados a entrar en la existencia agraciada de los hijos de Dios, llamados a ser apóstoles de esa misma gracia - esto es la realidad de cada uno de nosotros aquí presentes. Y esas llamadas sucesivas - en la lógica y en nuestra conciencia, tal vez, pero, de hecho, inseparablemente unidas en el plan eterno de Dios - encuentran su justificación exclusivamente en su acto de amor puro. Cuando no estábamos, él nos amó a nosotros para que podamos ser.

Llamado "en Cristo". Cristo es el patrón de todo, incluso desde el primer momento de la creación. Algunos científicos y filósofos de la ciencia, en las últimas décadas, se han referido a lo que ellos llaman "principio entrópico". Con esto quieren decir que la materia estaba constituida de tal manera desde el momento mismo de la "big bang", que casi parece estar diseñado para que la vida humana pudiera ser posible. Parece que tan sólo hay una diferencia de medio grado en la temperatura inicial en la creación que han hecho de nuestro mundo imposible. En realidad, como cristianos sabemos que Dios hizo el diseño del universo para el hombre ("Dios creó todo para el hombre", CCC 358; Cfr. 299), pero aún más, que creó todo en, por y para Cristo. Toda la creación de alguna manera lo refleja, todo está marcado por la gracia, que es "Christiform", "Veó su sangre sobre la rosa, y en las estrellas la gloria de sus ojos", escribió un poeta irlandés. Por encima de todo, él es el prototipo de lo que es ser humano y un hijo de Dios. La persona cuya vida se mueve dentro de una atmósfera de fe comienza a darse cuenta de que todo lo que conduce finalmente a él y compartir su vida.

Mensajeros renuentes. Amos (primera lectura) rechaza ser etiquetado como un profeta, porque, en el momento de su llamada, un gremio profesional de los autodenominados "profetas" le había dado un mal nombre a la profecía. "Yo no soy uno de esos", que quiere entender. "La única razón por la que estoy hablando en nombre de Dios es porque" él me obligó a hacerlo ". Toda vocación tiene este aspecto: no es nuestra elección. Dios llama. Y mientras nos deja libres de aceptar o rechazar la llamada, el hombre o la mujer que ha entendido lo que es Dios sólo conoce una respuesta tiene sentido.

Lo que el profeta tiene que decir no es el suyo, en el análisis final, si es o no es extraordinariamente brillante, o bien leído, o sabios, o con experiencia, o elocuente, no tiene ninguna relación. Sus palabras representan la mente de Dios (en términos humanos, por supuesto) a su pueblo, y es por esta razón que merecen credibilidad. Lo que el apóstol tiene que dar a los demás no es la suya tampoco, sino un don que le había dado Cristo. O más bien, el mismo Cristo es el regalo que el apóstol, como portador de su palabra y su gracia sanadora, ofrece a cada pueblo y ciudad.

History Corner

Saint Bruno Church currently has a large parish hall due to the hard work and generosity of our parishioners, and the guidance of Father Ronald Burke. It is interesting to note that the very first masses celebrated in San Bruno were at a hall. This was in 1906. Father James Cooper, pastor of Saint Michael's, Ocean View, celebrated the first San Bruno masses at Cody's Hall located at 812 Mills Avenue. The property was owned by Detective Cody of the San Francisco Police Department. He kept a span of horses in a stable and over the stable was a dance hall known as Cody's Hall. The building was later converted to a residence. By 1907 the Catholics of San Bruno were working to establish a parish.
