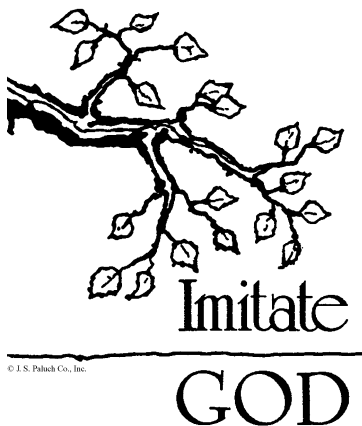


Saint Bruno Church

Four Funerals and a Wedding

They took place in a span of one week, the one which transitions from July to August. The first was on July 31st; that of Elmer Acosta, brother of Jose who is the coordinator at the 4:30PM Saturday mass. He died of natural causes. The following day, August 1st, was that of Al Lugo, a long-time parishioner who, with his wife Marie, was a regular at the 12NN mass. He died of cancer. On August 3rd we had a double funeral; cousins Usbaldo Gomez and Arnulfo Picazo, father and godfather, respectively, of baby girl Averiana Gomez. They died in that horrible car accident shortly after the baptism. The fourth funeral was on Saturday; that of Kikeau Leger, son of Tupe who is the musician at the 12NN Sunday mass. He died of a bad fall. Though the funeral was in New Zealand, the family and the Tongan community held a vigil service at the HPR Bistro.

The wedding was also last Saturday; that of Scott Carey who tied the knots with Maeve Kelly. He is the son of Kacey, our DRE. The first thing that I observed is that all who had the funerals and wedding were men. Second, they were young. Three were in their 30's, the oldest was 69 only. Third, the main cultural communities that make up our parish were all affected by these events: Elmer of the Filipino community; Al of the Latino-Caucasian community; Usbaldo and Arnulfo of the Latino community; Kikeau of the Tongan community, and; Scott of the Caucasian group.

Any death is hard to take, especially when the deceased is young and death comes suddenly and unexpectedly. That was the case with these deaths, especially for those who died in the accidents. There are "whys" that can't be answered. There are three things that I observed that soften the blow: faith, family and food. Faith is the assurance that God is with us in joy or in sorrow and the confidence that death does not have the last say. I observed in the calm demeanor of the bereaved families this kind of faith.

If the family (including extended families) is united, the members pull together. They stop their daily routine and make allowance to lend support, offer prayers and condolences or simply be present. The church jam packed at the double funeral. It was so moving to see so many people in attendance.

All the funerals were followed with reception. When family and friends come together for food and drink in a celebratory way, it is an expression of hope and an encouraging sign that despite such a debacle as death, life moves on. It's not that the grieving period is rushed or the dead forgotten but that eventually one has to shake off the somber mood and be up and about again and tackle life and its challenges with determination.

Faith, family and food were also were also accounted for at the wedding. A toast to the couple in looking forward to baptism, confirmation and first communion gatherings is a sure sign of faith-filled families. The party was sizeable of families and friend on both sides. And the food and drink were plentiful.

In the gospel today, Jesus says, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." - *John 6,14.*

Cuatro funerales y una Boda

Se llevaron a cabo en un lapso de una semana, entre julio y agosto. La primera fue el 31 de Julio, la de Elmer Acosta, hermano de José, quien es el coordinador en la misa de 16:30 del sábado. Él murió de causas naturales. Al día siguiente, 01 de agosto, fue la de Al Lugo, un feligrés desde hace mucho tiempo que, con su esposa Marie, era un habitual de la masa 12NN. Él murió de cáncer. El 3 de Agosto tuvimos un entierro doble, primos Usbaldo Gómez y Arnulfo Picazo, padre y padrino, respectivamente, de la niña Averiana Gómez. Ellos murieron en ese horrible accidente de coche poco después del bautismo. El funeral fue cuarto el sábado, el de Kikeau Leger, hijo de Tupe, que es el músico en la misa del Domingo a las 12PM. Murió de una caída. Aunque el funeral fue en Nueva Zelanda, la familia y la comunidad Tongana celebró una vigilia en el Bistro HPR.

La boda fue también el Sábado pasado, el de Scott Carey, que se caso con Maeve Kelly. Él es el hijo de Kacey, nuestra DRE. Lo primero que observé es que todos los que tenían los funerales y las bodas eran hombres. En segundo lugar, eran jóvenes. Tres estaban en sus 30s, el más viejo tenía 69 solamente. En tercer lugar, las principales comunidades culturales que conforman nuestra parroquia se vieron afectadas por estos eventos: Elmer de la comunidad filipina, Al de la comunidad latina/ Cáucasea; Usbaldo y Arnulfo de la comunidad latina; Kikeau de la comunidad de Tongana, y; Scott el grupo caucásico.

Toda muerte es difícil de aceptar, sobre todo cuando el difunto es joven y la muerte llega de repente e inesperadamente. Ese fue el caso de estas muertes, sobre todo para aquellos que murieron en los accidentes. Hay porqués que no pueden ser contestadas. Hay tres cosas que he observado que suavizan el golpe: la fe, la familia y la comida. La fe es la certeza de que Dios está con nosotros en la alegría o en la tristeza y la confianza de que la muerte no tiene la última palabra. He observado en la actitud calmada de las familias de las víctimas este tipo de fe.

Si la familia (incluyendo a las familias extendidas) está unido, los miembros de reunir. Se detienen su rutina diaria y tener en cuenta para prestar apoyo, ofrecer oraciones y condolencias o simplemente estar presente. El atasco de la iglesia llena en el entierro doble. Fue muy emocionante ver a tantas personas en asistencia.

Todos los funerales fueron seguidos de una recepción. Cuando la familia y amigos se reúnen para comer y beber de una manera festiva, es una expresión de esperanza y un signo alentador que, a pesar como una debacle con la muerte, la vida sigue adelante. No es que el período de duelo se precipitó o se olvida a los muertos, pero que con el tiempo uno tiene que sacudirse el estado de ánimo sombrío y se levante y camine de nuevo y hacer frente a la vida y sus retos con determinación.

La fe, la familia y la comida fueron parte de la boda. Un brindis por la pareja en espera de bautismo, confirmación y primera comunión reuniones es un signo seguro de las familias llenas de fe. El partido era importante de las familias y amigos en ambos lados. Y la comida y la bebida eran abundantes.

En el evangelio de hoy, Jesús dice: "Yo soy el pan vivo que descendió del cielo, y el que come de este pan vivirá para siempre; Y el pan que yo daré es mi carne para la vida del mundo" - *Jn 6, 14*

Long Time Parishioners

Silvia Corona Rivas is originally from Guadalajara, Mexico. She came to All Souls in 1951 where her first son was baptized. Her second son and daughter were born in 1951 and in that same year the family moved to San Bruno, where both children were baptized. Silvia recalls that the people at Saint Bruno Church were very nice and remembers the neighborhood at that time had a ranch-like way of living. She also recalls that in the early fifties almost all parishioners and priests were Caucasian and that the church was always full. Her husband passed away in 1970. Through the intercession of Father Burke, Silvia became the first Spanish Extraordinary Minister of the Holy Eucharist. We honor Silvia Corona Rivas as this week's long time parishioner.

History Corner

Father Charito Suan is originally from Mactan, Cebu, Philippines. In 1993-1994 Father Charito came to the United States as a visiting priest. While waiting for his first assignment, he became a part of Saint Bruno Church when our pastor, Father Ronald Burke, had a heart attack followed by surgery. We needed a substitute priest during that critical time. Father Charito was invited to our church by Deacon Ramon de la Rosa, who was not yet ordained as a deacon. Father Charito stayed at Saint Bruno's for five months until his first official assignment, which was at St. Matthew Church in San Mateo. At present Father Charito is the pastor of Saint Elizabeth Church in San Francisco. We thank Father Charito for his contribution to St. Bruno Church.
