**TWENTY THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

One of God's attributes is "the liberator". This is the attribute which this Sunday's liturgical texts especially focus on. God frees all human beings from their sad condition of outcasts, and he frees nature from its barren dryness (First Reading). He frees us from illnesses of the heart and of the spirit, "everything he does is good, he makes the deaf hear and the mute speak" (Gospel). He frees the Christian from any distinctions of class, for whether we are rich or poor; we are all the same before God (Gospel).

A free nature at the service of humanity. God created nature, but he did not then lose interest in it. Nature is our home, and so God exercises his providence over nature, so that it may serve us. This divine providence "frees" the earth from its misery. The first reading tells us that "the parched ground will become a marsh and the thirsty land springs of water." Human pride, the enemy of our true good, is invited to humble itself before such natural misfortunes, which to us are like a platform enabling us to leave our pride aside and go back to God.

Today's Gospel tells the story of how a deaf and dumb man was cured by Jesus. But God also intervenes to cure our spirit. "Lord, free me from all illness; especially free me from myself so that my life may be a song of praise to your holy name." James' exhortation in the second reading fits in perfectly here: "My brothers, do not let class distinctions enter into your faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord." The believer, having been freed of himself by baptism and the Eucharist, cannot go back to the slavery of the past. It would be like overturning God's liberation. St Peter says of Jesus in one of his speeches to the early Christians that "he went about doing good." John Paul II tells us that "The charity of Christians is the prolongation of the presence of Christ giving of himself Christ wishes to continue to free us from material needs, illness, natural disasters and spiritual ailments, through Christian believers. Indeed, it is truly wonderful to observe the generosity of so many millions of Christians in rescuing the needy in any part of the world. At the same time, as Christian believers we must ask ourselves a few questions: am I personally doing all the good that I can do? Do I wish others, individually or as a community, would do good? What is the kind of good that I like to do: material good, spiritual good, or both at the same time? To do good unto others in a disinterested way is a wonderful way to free them. To want to be freed. By experience, we know that we cannot free ourselves from such bonds on our own, especially when it comes to the deepest and strongest bonds. We need to be set free. But in order for this to happen, we must want to be set free. Liberation, therefore, is possible only for those who wish to be freed. In our world and in our environment, there are many people who claim to be "liberators", because what they free is not man in his greatness and dignity, but the foul pits of his passions, his selfishness, ambitions, nightmares and instincts. God is our true liberator. Our true liberator is Jesus Christ who died for us and rose from the dead for us. Have you accepted, do you really accept with all your heart, the freedom offered by Jesus Christ? If you want to be set free, have no doubts, he will free you.

VIGÉSIMO TERCER DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Uno de los atributos de Dios es "el libertador". Este es el atributo que los textos litúrgicos de este domingo se concentraran. Dios libera a todos los seres humanos de su triste condición, y libera a la naturaleza de su sequedad estéril (primera lectura). Él nos libera de las enfermedades del corazón y del espíritu, "todo lo que hace es bueno, hace oír a los sordos y hablar a los mudos" (Evangelio). El libera al cristiano de toda distinción de clase, por si somos ricos o pobres, todos somos iguales ante Dios (Evangelio).

Un carácter gratuito al servicio de la humanidad. Dios creó la naturaleza, pero no luego perder interés en ella. La naturaleza es nuestro hogar, y por eso Dios ejerce su providencia sobre la naturaleza, de modo que pueda servirnos. Esta providencia divina "libera" la tierra de su miseria. La primera lectura nos dice que "El lugar seco se convertirá en un pantano y el sequedal en manaderos de agua." El orgullo humano, el enemigo de nuestro verdadero bien, es invitado a humillarse ante estas desgracias naturales, que para nosotros son como una plataforma lo que nos permite dejar nuestro orgullo a un lado y volver a Dios.

El evangelio de hoy nos cuenta la historia de cómo un hombre sordo y mudo fue curado por Jesús. Pero Dios también interviene para curar nuestro espíritu. "Señor, me ha librado de todas las enfermedades, sobre todo libre de mí mismo, para que mi vida sea un canto de alabanza a su santo nombre." James "exhortación en la segunda lectura encaja perfectamente aquí:" Hermanos míos, no deje que la clase distinciones entre en su fe en Jesucristo, nuestro Señor glorificado. "El creyente, después de haber sido liberado de sí mismo por medio del bautismo y de la Eucaristía, no puede volver a la esclavitud del pasado. Sería como revocar la liberación de Dios.

San Pedro dice a Jesús en uno de sus discursos a los primeros cristianos que "pasó haciendo el bien." Juan Pablo II nos dice que "La caridad de los cristianos es la prolongación de la presencia de Cristo dando de sí mismo Cristo desea continuar liberarnos de las necesidades materiales, las enfermedades, los desastres naturales y las enfermedades espirituales, a través de los creyentes cristianos. En efecto, es verdaderamente maravilloso observar la generosidad de tantos millones de cristianos en el rescate de los necesitados en cualquier parte del mundo. Al mismo tiempo, como creyentes cristianos debemos hacer algunas preguntas: ¿estoy haciendo personalmente todo lo bueno que yo pueda hacer? ¿Deseo que otros, de forma individual o en comunidad, hacer el bien? ¿Cuál es el tipo de bien que me gusta hacer: un buen material bueno, espiritual, o ambas cosas a la vez? Hacer el bien a los demás de una manera desinteresada es una maravillosa manera de liberarlos. Querer ser liberados. Pero para que esto suceda, hay que quieren ser libres. Liberación, por lo tanto, sólo es posible para aquellos que desean ser liberados. En nuestro mundo y en nuestro entorno, hay muchas personas que dicen ser "libertadores", porque lo que no sucede con el hombre en su grandeza y dignidad, pero los pozos fétidos de sus pasiones, su egoísmo, ambiciones, pesadillas e instintos. Dios es nuestro verdadero liberador. Nuestro verdadero liberador es Jesucristo, que murió por nosotros y resucitó de entre los muertos para nosotros. ¿Ha aceptado usted, ¿de verdad aceptar con todo tu corazón, la libertad ofrecida por Jesucristo? Si quieres ser libre, no tengo dudas, él te libre.

History Corner

Twenty-four hour Perpetual Adoration of the Blessed

Sacrament began at St. Bruno Church on October 6, 1996 under the direction of Father Ronald Burke. The adoration chapel is St. Anne's Chapel on the San Bruno Avenue side of the church. A few years ago, a walkway was installed parallel to San Bruno Avenue to allow easy access to the chapel from the small parking lot. At that time the vestibule was closed in the evenings for security reasons. Loyal parishioners and people from other parishes or just people needing a place to pray during the day and night have assured that the Blessed Sacrament is never left alone. We are blessed at St. Bruno's to have one of the very few churches in the entire San Francisco Bay Area that has perpetual adoration. Father Burke decided it was appropriate to begin on October 6th, the Feast of St. Bruno. Thank you, Father Burke, for your vision.
