Homo

No, the word does not refer to a particular sexual orientation as in homosexuality. Homo is a Latin word which means "man." And "man" as used here does not refer to a particular gender. It is not "male" as opposed to "female". It covers the whole human race. Homo is the generic name used by anthropologists and paleontologists for modern humans as they appeared 2.4 million years ago.

In human evolution, three distinctive species are identified. First, there is the *homo habilis*. This is the "handyman"; species adept in using and fabricating tools. It is followed by the *homo erectus*. As the name implies, this species distinguished itself by standing erect, walking on two feet and therefore freeing the hands to manipulate objects. But the most remarkable evolution is the *homo sapiens*. The defining mark of this species is a larger brain. It can think, analyze and can make decisions. We all belong to this species.

This mental capability has allowed us to make far greater use of tools than any other species on earth. We can cook our food, dress ourselves, build houses and engage in arts, technology and religion. We are the full development of homo. With *homo sapiens*, human evolution has reached its peak. That maybe true physiologically speaking, but the development of the human spirit is still underway. Fr. Timothy Radcliff in his book "Why Go to Church?" mentions about becoming *homo eucharisticus*, a Eucharistic humanity. It is a new way of being human. It is becoming someone who lives by the Eucharist.

For we live in a consumerist society with its shopping malls that create desires in us that are never satisfied. Marketing is intended to make us dissatisfied with what we have. It fuels endless and unfulfilled cravings. Take the case of the I-phone. That 4.5" x 2.25" techno gizmo has a lot more than power than the computer that guided the Apollo 11 to the moon forty years ago. Yet, the internet is now abuzz with the anticipated release of I-phone 5 and soon the earlier versions would just become history.

The Eucharist teaches to desire well and deeply. It teaches us to desire for food and drink that satiates our thirst and satisfies our hunger. The bread and the wine, staple food and drink, become the body and blood of Christ that fill us. The Eucharist makes us to long for the time that we can partake of the celestial banquet. The Eucharist teaches us to enjoy what is given us, to curb our appetites and take pleasure in what we have. The Eucharist orients us to the things that last and not be distracted by what is ephemeral and transitory. We are called to become homo Eucharisticus.

In preparing for our centennial celebration, may we choose cooperation over competition, respect over arrogance, and unity over discord.

Homo

No, la palabra no se refiere a una determinada orientación sexual como en la homosexualidad. Homo es una palabra latina que significa "hombre." Y "hombre" como se usa aquí no se refiere a un género en particular. No es "masculino" en lugar de "femenino". Cubre toda la raza humana. Homo es el nombre genérico utilizado por los antropólogos y paleontólogos para los seres humanos modernos aparecieron 2.4 millones de años.

En la evolución humana, tres especies distintivas son identificadas. En primer lugar, existe el *homo habilis*. Este es el "handyman", especie experto en el uso y fabricación de herramientas. Le sigue el *homo erectus*. Como su nombre lo indica, esta especie se ha distinguido por de pie, caminar en dos pies y por lo tanto liberando las manos para manipular objetos. Pero la evolución más notable es el *homo sapiens*. El sello distintivo de esta especie es un cerebro más grande. Puede pensar, analizar y tomar decisiones. Todos pertenecemos a la especie. Esta capacidad mental que nos ha permitido hacer un mayor uso de las herramientas que cualquier otra especie en la tierra. Podemos cocinar nuestra comida, vestirnos, construir casas y dedicarse a las artes, la tecnología y la religión. Somos el pleno desarrollo del homo. Con *homo sapiens*, la evolución humana ha llegado a su punto máximo.

Eso puede ser cierto fisiológicamente hablando, pero el desarrollo del espíritu humano está todavía en curso. Fr. Timoteo Radcliff en su libro "¿Por qué ir a la iglesia?" Menciona acerca de convertirse en *homo eucharisticus*, una humanidad eucarística. Se trata de una nueva forma de ser humano. Cada vez es alguien que vive de la Eucaristía.

Para los que vivimos en una sociedad de consumo, con los centros comerciales que crean deseos en nosotros que nunca se sacian. El marketing es la intención de hacernos insatisfecho con lo que tenemos. Alimenta ansias infinitas e insatisfecho. Tomemos el caso del I-phone. Ese tecno gizmo de 4.5 "x 2.25" tiene un montón más de energía que el equipo que guió el Apolo 11 a la luna hace cuarenta años. Sin embargo, el Internet es ahora un hervidero con el esperado lanzamiento del I-phone 5 y pronto las versiones anteriores sólo se convertirá en la historia.

La Eucaristía nos enseña a desear bien y profundamente. Nos enseña a desear para la comida y la bebida que sacia nuestra sed y satisface nuestra hambre. El pan y el vino, alimentos básicos y bebidas, se convierten en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo la que nos llene. La Eucaristía nos hace añorar el tiempo que podamos participar del banquete celestial. La Eucaristía nos enseña a disfrutar de lo que se nos ha dado, para frenar nuestro apetito y disfrutar de lo que tenemos. La Eucaristía nos orienta hacia las cosas que duran y no ser distraídos por lo que es efímero y transitorio. Estamos llamados a ser homo Eucharisticus .

En la preparación para la celebración de nuestro centenario, podemos elegir la cooperación sobre la competencia, el respeto a través de la arrogancia, y la unidad a través de la discordia.

In 2004 he was assigned as the assistant coordinator for the noon Sunday Mass by Fr. Rene, and in 2011 was assigned by Father Michael as the coordinator. Taufui has been the chairperson for the Parish Pastoral Council since 2011. We truly honor Taufui and Kalini as outstanding examples of couples working together for St. Bruno Church. Thank you both!

John and Ruby Valdez are remembered as very active members of St. Bruno Church since the 1970's. They were involved in the Parish Pastoral Council, Justice and Peace, the St. Bruno Festival, the Office on Restoration, CCD, the Archbishop's Annual Appeal (Triple A), the Counting Committee, and both served as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. For many years they were the assistant coordinators of the then 9 a.m. Sunday Mass with Gloria and Jose Flores. They were also active members in the Good Shepherd small Christian Community which included Gloria and Jose, Aldo and Gini Malaspina, Daie Sheehan, Beverly Kious, Joe Lacey, and others. They hosted the meetings often at their home in San Bruno. During Father Rene's time as pastor they were involved in the Finance and Advisory Board. John also worked as the electrician for the church. Upon the recommendation of Father Rene to the Papacy of John Paul II, John Valdez received an award for his service in 2000 during the term of Archbishop Levada.
