TWENTY FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

With his person, his teachings and his life, Jesus Christ has brought about a change in our world. The texts of this Sunday's liturgy focus on this change. The godless man who does not understand or accept the life of the upright is asked to change his attitude (First Reading). Jesus' disciples need to change their mentality before the surprising teachings of their Master (Gospel). James proposes to the Christians a spiritual plan which calls for a change in the lifestyle that they had before (Second Reading).

Changing one's attitude. What is the godless man's attitude towards the upright man? What is the attitude of the pagan - or of the renegade Jew living in Alexandria of Egypt - towards the Jew who was faithful to the law regulating his entire life.

Changing our mentality. Jesus' disciples simply cannot comprehend why their Master must go through the passageway of suffering, that in order to be first, one must be the servant of all that in the new categories of the Kingdom of Christ the child occupies a prominent place. It is not easy for them to leave behind the lessons they received in their education as children. But if they want to be disciples of Christ, they must change.

Changing our life. If changing one's way of thinking is difficult, changing one's life is even more so. Baptism and the Eucharist restructure us from within, pour a new way of being and a new principle of action into us. This is the basis for changing our lives. But this change requires the grace of God, human work and time for the new structures to be assimilated and to configure our behavior day after day, deed after deed. Only when we have achieved this new existential configuration is "the wisdom that comes down from above... something pure; it is also peaceable, kindly and considerate; it is full of mercy and shows itself by doing good. Nor is there any trace of partiality or hypocrisy in it." It will guide human behavior in every moment. Without this configuration, which requires grace, effort and time, the old structures will continue to exist, and with them, our actions will be guided by dispute, greed, the desire for pleasure and envy. Changing one's life is the great task of the Christian, which must be undertaken with determination and enthusiasm.

Change according to God. The culture in which we live and the mentality of our contemporaries is based on change. It is easier than ever before to change jobs, computers, cars, houses or countries. One can also change one's way of thinking and living, and even one's religion. Change happens every day, and those who don't change quickly are left behind. Change is inherent in progressively-minded people, who seem to have change written in their DNA. But not all change is good. Nor is all change indicative of progress. The change that God wants is from injustice to justice, from abuse to the service of others, from unfaithfulness to faithfulness, from hatred to love, from vengeance to forgiveness, from the culture of death to the culture of life, from sin to grace and holiness.

Your plan of life. Every person outlines a plan of life, more or less clearly. What we want to be, to do, what values we cannot renounce, what means we will live by. Make it a plan that will keep you active in your mission within the Church: teach catechism, join the parish choir, devote greater attention to the spiritual and moral education of your children. At the end of the day or the week, reflect a little on how you put your plan into practice. A small plan can do a world of good!

VIGÉSIMO QUINTO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Con su persona, sus enseñanzas y su vida, Jesucristo ha traído consigo un cambio en nuestro mundo. Los textos de la liturgia de este Domingo se centran en este cambio. El hombre sin Dios que no entiende o acepta la vida de los rectos se le pide que cambie su actitud (en primera lectura). Los discípulos de Jesús tienen que cambiar su mentalidad antes de que las enseñanzas sorprendentes de su Maestro (Evangelio). James les propone a los cristianos un plan espiritual que exige un cambio en el estilo de vida que tenían antes (segunda lectura).

Cambio de actitud. ¿Cuál es la actitud del hombre sin Dios hacia el hombre de bien? ¿Cuál es la actitud de los paganos - ni de los vivos Judío renegado en Alejandría de Egipto - hacia el Judío que fue fiel a la ley que regula toda su vida.

Cambiar nuestra mentalidad. Los discípulos de Jesús simplemente no pueden comprender por qué su Maestro debe pasar por sufrimiento, que para ser el primero, uno debe estar al servicio de todos los que en las nuevas categorías del Reino de Cristo, el niño ocupa un lugar prominente. No es fácil para ellos salir de detrás de las lecciones que recibieron en su formación cuando eran niños.

Pero si quieren ser discípulos de Cristo, deben cambiar.

Cambiar nuestra vida. Si un cambio de manera de pensar es difícil, cambiando la vida de uno es más aún. El Bautismo y la Eucaristía nos reestructurar desde dentro, vierta una nueva manera de ser y de un nuevo principio de acción en nosotros. Esta es la base del cambio en nuestras vidas. Pero este cambio requiere de la gracia de Dios, el trabajo humano y la hora de las nuevas estructuras que se asimilan y configurar nuestro comportamiento día a día, acción tras acción. Sólo cuando hayamos logrado esta configuración existencial nuevo es "la sabiduría que viene de lo alto ... algo puro, sino también pacífica, amable y considerado, sino que está lleno de misericordia y se manifiesta por hacer el bien. Tampoco hay rastro de parcialidad ni hipocresía en él. "Va a guiar el comportamiento humano en cada momento. Sin esta configuración, que requiere gracia, esfuerzo y tiempo, las viejas estructuras seguirán existiendo, y con ellos, nuestras acciones serán guiadas por disputa, la codicia, el deseo de placer y envidia. Cambiar la vida de uno es la gran tarea del cristiano, que debe llevarse a cabo con determinación y entusiasmo.

Cambia según Dios. La cultura en que vivimos y la mentalidad de nuestros contemporáneos se basan en el cambio. Es más fácil que nunca para cambiar de trabajo, computadoras, automóviles, casas o países. También se puede cambiar de manera de pensar y de vivir, e incluso la religión de uno. El cambio sucede todos los días, y los que no cambian rápidamente se quedan atrás. El cambio es inherente a las personas con mentalidad progresiva, que parecen tener el cambio por escrito en su ADN. Pero no todo cambio es bueno. Tampoco es todo cambio indicativo del progreso. El cambio que Dios quiere es la injusticia a la justicia, contra el abuso al servicio de los demás, de la infidelidad a la fidelidad, del odio al amor, de la venganza al perdón, de la cultura de la muerte a la cultura de la vida, del pecado a la gracia y la santidad.

Su plan de vida. Cada persona presenta un plan de vida, más o menos claramente. Lo que queremos ser, hacer, cuáles son los valores que no podemos renunciar, lo que significa que vamos a vivir. Que sea un plan que te mantendrá activo en su misión dentro de la Iglesia: enseñar catecismo, se unen al coro de la parroquia, presten mayor atención a la educación espiritual y moral de sus hijos. Al final del día o la semana, reflexionar un poco sobre cómo poner su plan en práctica. Un plan pequeño puede hacer mucho bien!



Mary Mulhall grew up in San Francisco, and attended Catholic schools there as a child. After obtaining an accounting degree from USF she worked as an accountant for 19 years. Prior to her retirement she attended St. Robert's. After retirement in the mid 80's she started going to St. Bruno's, where she met Daie Sheehan, who was very active in CCD, liturgy, and YLI. Mary approached the pastor, Father Burke, offering her services to assist the secretary, Indiana Blandon, and the finance committee. Within weeks she was in charge of the weekly cash counting crew who were in their 90's at the time and ready to retire. St. Bruno heard her prayers and soon a new crew was formed. They called themselves "The Money-changers". They met every Monday after mass to sort and report all of the funds received for the parish. She also supervised and prepared the financial reports, which had been in need of revision. After 12 years she retired from her services. Mary now lives in Sterling Court in Burlingame where she coordinates communion services provided by a priest from St. Catherine's. She still keeps in touch with The Money-changers from 15 years ago, who included Indiana Blandon, Eddie Wilson Jr., Sam Murray, Daie Sheehan, and John and Ruby Valdez. Dedication to the Catholic faith runs in her family; two family members are priests, and her grandchildren are currently attending Catholic schools. We thank Mary Mulhall for her contributions to St. Bruno Church and wish her every blessing.

History Corner

The growth of St. Bruno Church and Parish is the result of the vision, dedication, and hard work of many of our pastors. We would like to recognize four who have made very noticeable impacts. Beginning in 1912, our first pastor Father William J. Cantwell erected the present parochial residence, secured the organ and statues for the church, did the street work and the sidewalks on the church grounds, and secured more land. In 1958, Father John G. O'Connell purchased six homes, three of which were removed to make way for the new St. Bruno Church building and parking lot. He also supervised the landscaping of the church grounds and remodeled the rectory. Starting in the mid 80's, Father Ronald A. Burke was responsible for the building of the main parish hall, rebuilding of the rectory from top to bottom including the addition of the offices around the rectory, the creation of the courtyard, and the remodeling of other parish buildings and halls. Father Burke did much of the labor himself. Father Michael Brillantes has supervised the remodeling and redecorating of the interior of the rectory and offices, remodeling of the courtyard, refurbishing of the church interior and exterior including the raising of the sanctuary, replacement of the Stations of the Cross, replacement of the courtyard doors including expansion of the door to the vestibule from a single to a double door, creation of the paved pathway from the small parking lot to the Adoration Chapel, and replacement of the floors in the Adoration Chapel and the Sacristy. These are just four of our dedicated pastors whose contributions include visible changes to our parish. We have been truly blessed at St. Bruno's to have pastors with great vision.
