Angels

Angels are mentioned both in the Old Testament and the New Testament. It was an angel that prevented Abraham from sacrificing his son Isaac. In the life of Jesus, angels were present from the annunciation to the ascension.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that angels are creatures like us endowed with intelligence. Their role is to be messengers. They work for our benefit. In ministering to us they sometimes assume human form.

Angels are basically good but some angels waged war against God and they were driven out of heaven into hell. These are the fallen angels. Satan is their leaders and his followers are called devils.

The church celebrates the feast of Archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael on September 29. Michael (who is like God) was the archangel who fought against Satan and his followers. Gabriel (strength of God) announced the birth of John the Baptist and of Jesus. Raphael (medicine of God) is the archangel who took care of Tobias on his journey.

By the way, we are bidding goodbye today to the gargantuan statue of St. Michael. It will be donated to St. Michael Parish in Tonga. A smaller statue will take its place.

On December 18 last year, I was at Palm Spring to preside at the mass of town mates. At the start of the mass I gave an instruction on the lighting of the advent wreath. Suddenly an middle-aged man interrupted me with a question, "Father, how can you afford to be away from your parish on a Sunday?" I was taken aback but I managed to answer calmly, "Well, I have Father Rafael with me in the parish and he's doing the masses." Unfazed the guy said, "So you are Michael and your companion is Rafael. Where is Gabriel?" I had a flash of inspiration and I shot back, "Don't you know? He went to Nazareth?" The annunciation was the gospel of that Sunday.

One day when I was still at St. Peter Church in the Mission District, I was rushing to the garage for my work as chaplain at San Francisco General Hospital when a lady came running after me. She asked, "Are you Fr. Angel?" I was feeling snooty so I answered, "No. I'm not an angel. I'm an archangel." By the way, there is a Fr. Angel who is in residence at Mater Dolorosa Church. He will preside at the mass this afternoon (Sunday) in celebration of the feast of St. Lorenzo Ruiz.

When I was still in the seminary, a German professor told the story of a priest who did not believe in the existence of angels so he left the priesthood. The professor continued, "After a few months we learned that he already had an angel in his arms."

We are five days away from our 100th anniversary. We should be wrapping up our preparations. It's not the time to rush doing things we should have done earlier. It's time to relax and take things easy.

Finally, here's a beautiful saying about angels from an anonymous author: "We are each of us angels with one wing, to fly we need only to embrace each other."

Ángeles

Los ángeles son mencionados tanto en el Antiguo Testamento y el Nuevo Testamento. Fue un ángel que impidió a Abraham de sacrificar a su hijo Isaac. En la vida de Jesús, los ángeles estaban presentes desde la Anunciación hasta la Ascensión.

El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica nos enseña que los ángeles son criaturas como nosotros, dotado de inteligencia. Su papel es ser mensajeros. Ellos trabajan para nuestro beneficio. En ministerar a nosotros que a veces asumen forma humana.

Los ángeles son básicamente buenos pero algunos ángeles declararon la guerra contra Dios y fueron expulsados del cielo al infierno. Estos son los ángeles caídos. Satanás es su líder y sus seguidores son llamados demonios.

La Iglesia celebra la fiesta de los Arcángeles Miguel, Gabriel y Rafael, el 29 de septiembre. Miguel (que es como Dios) fue el arcángel que luchó contra Satanás y sus seguidores. Gabriel (fuerza de Dios) anunció el nacimiento de Juan el Bautista y de Jesús. Rafael (medicina de Dios) es el arcángel que se hizo cargo de Tobías en su viaje.

Por cierto, digámosle adiós hoy a la colosal estatua de San Miguel. Se donó a la parroquia de San Miguel en Tonga. Una estatua más pequeña ocupará su lugar.

El 18 de Diciembre del año pasado, yo estaba en Palm Spring para presidir la misa de los compañeros. Al inicio de la misa di una instrucción sobre la iluminación de la corona de adviento. De repente, un hombre de mediana edad me interrumpió con una pregunta: "Padre, ¿cómo puede darse el lujo de estar lejos de su parroquia en un Domingo?" Me sorprendió, pero me las arreglé para responder con calma: "Bueno, tengo conmigo el Padre Rafael en la parroquia que está haciendo las misas. "Sin inmutarse el hombre dijo:" Así que tú eres Miguel y tu compañero es Rafael. ¿Dónde está Gabriel?" "Tuve un momento de inspiración y conteste:" ¿Acaso no sabes? Fue a Nazaret "La anunciación fue el Evangelio de ese Domingo.

Un día, cuando yo todavía estaba en la iglesia de San Pedro en el Distrito de la Misión, fui corriendo al garaje de mi trabajo como capellán en el Hospital General de San Francisco cuando una mujer vino corriendo detrás de mí. Ella preguntó: "¿Está usted el Padre Angel?" "Me sentía tan presumido le respondí:" No, No soy un ángel. Yo soy un arcángel. "Por cierto, hay un Padre Ángel que está en residencia en Mater Dolorosa Iglesia. Él presidirá la misa de esta tarde (Domingo) en la celebración de la fiesta de San Lorenzo Ruiz.

Cuando yo todavía estaba en el seminario, un profesor alemán contó la historia de un sacerdote que no creía en la existencia de los ángeles por lo que abandonó el sacerdocio. El profesor continuó: "Después de unos meses nos enteramos de que él ya tenía un ángel en sus brazos."

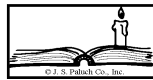
