Celebration

Here I'm sitting in my room at Vallombrosa Retreat Center, Menlo Park, trying to clear my mind and tune in to prayer but am having a hard time. There are just too many interesting images from the 3-day celebration of our centenary that flit in and out.

The formal dinner and awarding night had the feel of a gathering of celebrities. The women were elegant in their evening gowns and the men were debonair. I smile in remembrance at that time when many got on the floor to shake and sway with abandon. Suddenly the music stopped. Everyone was frozen in place. It took some time to figure out what went wrong, a busted fuse. Ordinarily, people would have taken the fiasco in stride and returned to their seats, except that it was not an ordinary night and nobody left the dance floor. No, you can't stop the music!

The centennial mass on Saturday was just incredibly great! The flowers, the drapes, the candles, altar cloth, the vestments, the garlands, the incense, the singing, dancing and processing were so exquisitely woven together to create one awesome experience. And let's not forget the heart-warming homily delivered by Archbishop Quinn.

The coronation ball started with the grand entrance of past queens looking so lovely and adorable. Then the candidates walked in and each one presented a dance number. Finally, the queen was announced. What a pleasant surprise! Nobody expected it at all but Yanaris certainly deserves the crown. She worked hard. Every weekend she and her parents were in the courtyard selling recycled items. She is always so genial, cheerful and amiable. Equally admirable is the sportsmanly attitude displayed by the Tongan community which raised by far the biggest amount in the history of St. Bruno's. There was no ill-feeling at all. I commend the Mahe family, especially Naomi, for graciousness. Denise was demure and lady-like throughout. Princess Christabella beamed with pride. The program ended past midnight but lights in the hall did not go out till 4AM. Two hours later, the place came to life again. "How many hours did you sleep?" was the question I asked of familiar faces in the hall. Some slept 4 hours, others 3. A number said they didn't sleep at all. When you have a good thing coming you want to savor every minute of it. There'll be time for sleep later. So on with the party. It started right after the Spanish mass and ended a little before the evening mass. That's more than six hours of continuous entertainment.

I loved all the cultural presentations from the Philippine serenade and fiesta experience to the Panamanian, Mexican, Brazilian, Guatemalan, Peruvian, Colombian, Salvadorean and Nicaraguan dance numbers. The Pacific island traditions came to life with the participation not only of the Tongans but from Guam, Fiji and Samoa. We also thank our brothers and sisters of neighboring Methodist Church, led by Rev. Koloto, for their strong participation in rendering religious songs complete with orchestra.

Thanks, everyone. May our beautiful celebration lead us to deeper faith in God, closer relationship with one another and imbue in us a missionary spirit.

Aquí estoy sentado en mi habitación en Vallombrosa Retreat Center, Menlo Park, tratando de despejar mi mente y en sintonía con la oración, pero estoy teniendo un mal rato. Hay demasiadas imágenes interesantes de la celebración de 3 días de nuestro centenario que revolotean en mi mente.

La cena de gala tenía el ambiente de una reunión de celebridades. Las mujeres estaban muy elegantes en sus vestidos de noche y los hombres también. Sonríe en memoria en ese momento en que muchos estaban en la pista para agitar y sacudir con abandono. De repente la música se detuvo. Todo el mundo se congeló en su lugar. 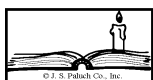

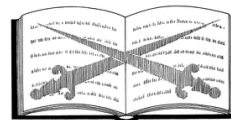
