FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER

The renowned artist Paul Gustave Dore once lost his passport while travelling in Europe. When he came to a border crossing, he explained his predicament to one of the guards. Giving his name to the official, Dore hoped he would be recognized and allowed to pass. The guard, however, said that many people attempted to cross the border by claiming to be persons they were not. Dore insisted that he was the man he claimed to be. "All right," said the official, "we'll give you a test, and if you pass it we'll allow you to go through." Handing him a pencil and a sheet of paper, he told the artist to sketch several peasants standing nearby. Dore did it so quickly and skillfully that the guard was convinced he was indeed who he claimed to be. His action confirmed his identity.

Christians have always had the problem of how to tell the world who they are. At some periods in history and still in some places in the world, uniforms have played a very important role in announcing our identity to the world. This usually takes the form of white flowing gowns, with headgear and sashes of different colors distinguishing members according to their various ranks. In the mainline churches, however, the use of uniforms or habits has become less popular. In these churches the words of Shakespeare in *Measure for Measure*, "Cucullus non facit monachum (the hood does not make a monk)" have been taken more seriously.

The quest for uniforms, habits, badges, banners and pinups designed to distinguish believers from non-believers does indeed have its place in the celebration of who are. We are symbolic beings who need to express our faith in symbolic ways. Jesus himself wrestled with the question of how to distinguish his followers from the non-believers around them. But his prescription goes much farther than external habits and uniforms. For Jesus the essential mark of distinction between Christians and non-Christians is not in the way we dress but in the way we live.

I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another (John 13:34-5).

Love is the Christian identity. Love is the Christian uniform. Love is the Christian habit. If you are wearing the habit of love, you are in. If you are not wearing love as a habit, you are out. Jesus wants the world to recognize us as Christians. We need to evangelize and witness to people around us. Words are only a small part of our witnessing for Christ. As St Francis of Assisi told his friars, "Preach the gospel at all times and use words if necessary."

The great Mahatma Gandhi was asked about his view of Christianity. What he said could show us what probably is keeping two-thirds of the world away from the Good News of Christianity: I have a great respect for Christianity. I often read the Sermon on the Mount and have gained much from it. I know of no one who has done more for humanity than Jesus. In fact, there is nothing wrong with Christianity, but the trouble is with you Christians. You do not begin to live up to your own teachings.

Domingo 5 DE PASCUA

El reconocido artista Paul Gustave Dore una vez perdió su pasaporte al viajar por Europa. Cuando llegó a un cruce de frontera, explicó su situación a uno de los guardias. Dando su nombre al oficial, Dore esperaba que sería reconocido y se dejó pasar. El guardia, sin embargo, dijo que muchas personas intentaron cruzar la frontera, alegando que las personas que no lo eran. Dore insistió en que él era el hombre que decía ser. "Está bien," dijo el funcionario, "le daremos una prueba, y si se le pasa que va a permitir que usted pueda pasar." Dándole un lápiz y una hoja de papel, le dijo al artista para dibujar varios campesinos que estaban cerca. Dore hizo con tanta habilidad y destreza que el guardia estaba convencido de que era realmente quien decía ser. Su acción confirma su identidad.

Los cristianos siempre han tenido el problema de la forma de decirle al mundo lo que son. En algunos períodos de la historia y aún en algunos lugares del mundo, los uniformes han jugado un papel muy importante en el anuncio de nuestra identidad ante el mundo. Esto por lo general toma la forma de vestidos que fluyen blancos, con cascós y cinturones de diferentes colores miembros distinguen por sus diferentes rangos. En las iglesias principales, sin embargo, el uso de uniformes o hábitos se ha vuelto menos popular. En estas iglesias las palabras de Shakespeare en Medida por medida ", cucullus no facit monachum (la campana no tiene un monje)" se han tomado más en serio.

La búsqueda de los uniformes, los hábitos, las insignias, banderas y pinups diseñados para distinguir a los creyentes de los no creyentes tiene de hecho su lugar en la celebración de lo que son. Somos seres simbólicos que necesitan para expresar nuestra fe de manera simbólica. Jesús luchó con la cuestión de cómo distinguir a sus seguidores de los no creyentes a su alrededor. Pero su receta va mucho más allá de los hábitos y uniformes externos. Para Jesús la marca esencial de la distinción entre cristianos y no cristianos no está en la forma de vestir, sino en la forma en que vivimos.

Les doy un mandamiento nuevo: que os améis unos a otros. Como yo os he amado, que también os améis unos a otros. En esto conocerán todos que sois mis discípulos, si os tenéis amor los unos a los otros (Juan 13:34-5).

El amor es la identidad cristiana. El amor es el uniforme cristiana. El amor es la costumbre cristiana. Si usted está usando el hábito del amor, que se encuentran Si usted no está usando el amor como una costumbre, estás fuera.

Jesús quiere que el mundo nos reconoce como cristianos. Tenemos que evangelizar y dar testimonio de las personas que nos rodean. Las palabras son sólo una pequeña parte de nuestro testimonio para Cristo. En San Francisco de Asís dijo a sus hermanos: "Predicar el evangelio en todo momento y usar palabras si es necesario." El gran Mahatma Gandhi le preguntaron sobre su visión de la cristianidad. Lo que dijo nos puede mostrar lo que probablemente es mantener las dos tercera partes del mundo fuera de la Buena Nueva del cristianismo:

Tengo un gran respeto por el cristianismo. Suelo leer el Sermón de la Montaña y he ganado mucho con él. No sé de nadie que haya hecho más por la humanidad que Jesús. De hecho, no hay nada malo con el cristianismo, pero el problema está en ustedes los cristianos. No empiece a vivir de acuerdo con sus propias enseñanzas. El mejor homenaje que podemos rendir a la fe cristiana es vivir de tal manera que a través de nosotros, las personas comienzan a tener una visión del amor ilimitado e incondicional que Dios nos ha manifestado en Cristo.

May, the Month of Mary

Este tiempo de gracia confiado a María: bendecida porque creyó Meditación

El conocimiento del contenido de la fe no es suficiente. El corazón, auténtico sagrario de la persona, debe abrirse por la gracia que permite tener ojos para mirar en profundidad y comprender (ver Benedicto XVI, La puerta de la fe, 10).

Durante mayo, en este Año de la Fe, el tiempo de Pascua culmina en la ascensión de Cristo y la venida del Espíritu Santo en Pentecostés. El Domingo de la Santísima Trinidad nos ayuda a hacer la transición al Tiempo Ordinario, ese largo período de domingos y semanas "verdes" cuando celebramos el cuidado providencial del Padre, el amor redentor del Hijo y el consejo perdurable del Espíritu Santo. Pero mayo, el hermoso mes de la maternidad de la naturaleza, siempre se dedica a nuestra Santísima Madre María. 
