The Parish Councils

Saint Bruno Parish has two councils: the pastoral and the finance. The first is recommendatory; the second is obligatory. The Pastoral Council gives advice to the pastor on matters affecting the life and ministry of the parish. It serves as the policy-formulating body of the parish in all matters of pastoral ministry. These include worship, religious education, hospitality, social concerns and youth affairs. There are 17 members of the Pastoral Council who are either elected or appointed or ex officio. The Pastoral Council meets on the 3rd Thursday of the month.

The Finance Council gives advice to the pastor in the wise stewardship of the goods of the parish. The coverage includes financial reporting, budget preparation, property management and stewardship program. There are 9 members who have expertise in different areas like accounting, administration, facility maintenance and fundraising. The Finance Council meets every 2nd Thursday of the month.

On Sunday, September 22nd, the new set of officers and members of both Councils will have their official acknowledgment and commissioning at the 12 noon mass. Let us support them with our prayers that they may share their talent and time with generosity and humility for the betterment of our parish and for the building of the Kingdom of God.

Pithy statements have a way of catching attention and tickling the imagination. I like this one which I read in a book: *well begun is half done*. It simply means that when you start a project right, you are almost assured of its successful completion. This draws attention to the importance of preparation. A program or a project has to be thoroughly thought out and well planned if one desires its accomplishment. Right at the start, everything must be ready. The invitation has been sent out, the needed materials are procured, the meeting place is set up and cleaned, the support staff has been trained and the resource speakers are prepared. Every little detail is attended; nothing is left to chance. When you do this, you create the impression of professionalism which translates into respect for participants which in turn lead to warm acceptance of what you are trying to promote. Pour a lot of effort at the preparation phase, and then when the thing starts, things will just flow smoothly. It saves one from a lot of worry and anxiety. It is even cost-efficient.

In the gospel today the Lord asks of us: "What have you done with the many things and the people I have entrusted to you?" We speak much today of accountability not only for our jobs, our finances, our families and our parishes, but accountability for our own very lives. God has put so much into our hands: the material things we have as well as our gifts and talents. These are not just personal gifts for our own enjoyment. They are meant for our communities and for the building of the Kingdom of God. May we give a good account to the Lord.

The annual financial report will be given at all masses next weekend.

Los Consejos Parroquiales

La parroquia San Bruno cuenta con dos consejos: el pastoral y el financiero. El primero es recomendado y el segundo es obligatorio. El Consejo Pastoral da consejos al pastor sobre asuntos que afectan la vida y el ministerio de la parroquia. Sirve como órgano de formulación de políticas de la parroquia en todos los asuntos del ministerio pastoral. Estos incluyen el culto, la enseñanza religiosa, la hospitalidad, las preocupaciones sociales y asuntos de la juventud. Hay 17 miembros del Consejo Pastoral que, o bien son elegidos o designados, o de oficio. El Consejo Pastoral se reúne el 3er jueves de cada mes.

El Consejo de Finanzas asesora al pastor en la administración de los bienes de la parroquia. La cobertura incluye la información financiera, preparación de presupuestos, gestión de la propiedad y el programa de administración. Hay 9 miembros que tienen experiencia en diferentes áreas como contabilidad, administración, mantenimiento de las instalaciones y de recaudación de fondos. El Consejo de Finanzas se reúne cada segundo jueves del mes.

El domingo 22 de septiembre, el nuevo grupo de miembros de los dos Consejos tendrán su reconocimiento oficial en la misa las 12pm. Apoyemolos con nuestras oraciones para que puedan compartir su talento y su tiempo con generosidad y humildad para el mejoramiento de nuestra parroquia y para la construcción del Reino de Dios.

Declaraciones pithy tienen una manera de captar la atención y hacer cosquillas a la imaginación. Este me gusta lo que he leído en un libro: así comenzó a medio hacer. Simplemente significa que cuando se inicia un proyecto de la derecha, que está casi seguro de su finalización exitosa. Esto llama la atención sobre la importancia de la preparación. Un programa o un proyecto se ha pensado a fondo y bien planificado, si uno desea su realización. Nada más debe de empezar, todo debe estar listo. La invitación ha sido enviada, los materiales necesarios obtenidos, el lugar de reunión se configura y se limpian, el personal de apoyo se ha formado y se preparan los altavoces de recursos. Se asistió a cada pequeño detalle, nada se deja al azar. Al hacer esto, se crea la impresión de profesionalismo que se traduce en el respeto a los participantes que a su vez conducen a calentar la aceptación de lo que usted está tratando de promover. Vierta un gran esfuerzo en la fase de preparación, y luego, cuando comienza la cosa, las cosas fluyen sin problemas. Se salva de una gran cantidad de preocupación y ansiedad. Incluso es rentable.

En el Evangelio de hoy el Señor nos pide: "¿Qué has hecho con las muchas cosas y la gente que he confiado a ti?" Se habla mucho hoy de la responsabilidad no sólo por nuestros trabajos, nuestras finanzas, nuestras familias y nuestras parroquias, pero la responsabilidad de nuestras propias vidas mismas. Se significan para nuestras comunidades y para la construcción del Reino de Dios. Podemos dar buena cuenta al Señor.

Reflection

God truly blessed me with the opportunity to go on a mission to Guatemala this summer. How did it start? It was all *God's plan!* My cousins & I flew to Guatemala City, drove four hours to a village (Coban, Alta Verapaz), and began our project from there. We distributed school supplies to 3 schools that lacked the *basic* necessities.

Some students walk *hours* to school and carry all their school supplies in a *plastic bag*. One school was 45 minutes into the woods from the village, then a 30 minute walk from the road up the mountains! With the second school we visited, I was struck with emotion when the school principal informed us that many students eagerly wait for brunch (two crackers and a juice box) at school because they have *nothing* else to eat *all* day. I felt like I was stealing *so* much from them when I was offered this snack. I reflected on how we waste food daily, throwing away what other people may truly appreciate.

Top 10 "take-homes" from the Guatemala mission

1. Seek to be rich in humility, rather than to be rich in money
2. Don't take educational opportunities for granted.
3. Strive for your goals. Don't give up until you reach success.
4. Give God thanks for everything you've been given on this day.
5. Pray! Always stay close to God.
6. The teacher (God) is always quiet during the test. Even when we struggle in life & don't feel God's presence with us, it doesn't mean that He's not there.
7. God works in us and shines through us.
8. Do not go a day without asking yourself, "What did the Holy Spirit do in me today?" and "What did I do to get closer to God on this day?"
9. Embrace and value the small things in life, remembering that everything belongs to God, and nothing belongs to us, even ourselves.
10. "Throwing away food is like stealing from the table of the poor and the hungry" - Pope Francis
