Saint Bruno – Part II

Humility, simplicity and a life of prayer define the life of Saint Bruno. Twice he was asked to become a bishop. The first time was when he was returning to Reims (France) after serious conflict with the bishop led him to leave. The people who knew him so well, his dedicated and humble service petitioned that he becomes their bishop. He turned them down to their great dismay. The second time was when he was summoned to Rome by his former student who was elected Pope, Urban II. He accepted the role to be a papal adviser but declined the offer to be ordained a bishop, a rank and title that normally go with the office of a papal adviser.

The miter, the staff and the ring would have been impressive symbols of his achievements, a testament to his superior intellect and a proof of his deep spirituality. He would have been placed in that unique position of authority. People would have knelt before him, kiss his ring and address him with lofty titles such as “your Excellency” or “Most Reverend”. Saint Bruno would have none of these. He preferred instead the life of a hermit. His statue prominently displayed in the vestibule speaks well of the humble Saint Bruno. His head is bowed. So humble is this man that he would not even dare look up.

Saint Bruno observed a simple life. He lived in a hermitage with a simple room, a bed and a table. He neither ate meat nor drank alcohol. He worked hard, read a lot and prayed much. At regular intervals, he prayed with his fellow monks: he got up at midnight, 5:30 in the morning, at noon, 3PM and 6 in the evening.

Monday, October 7, is the Feast of Mary under her title as Our Lady of the Rosary. St. Bruno had a deep love and affection to Mary. Let us pray the rosary if possible every day, for peace, for harmony for global security. Let us be inspired by Saint Bruno who never ceased to stop praying. Let our parish be a praying community.

Dear Saint Bruno, help to us live a life of humility, simplicity and prayer. May the Eucharist for which you had a profound affection draw us closer to Christ and to one another Amen.

I am happy to welcome to our parish the youth performers *Mga Anak ni Inang Daigdig* from Smokey Mountain, the dumpsite in Manila where Fr. Ben Beltran worked for many years. The group will perform a series of concerts in the Bay Area that showcase the riches of the Filipino cultural heritage through dances and rituals. The group will present a sample at our festival. They are scheduled to perform at Skyline College on October 12 at 2PM & 7PM.

San Bruno - Parte II

La humildad, la sencillez y la vida de oración definen la vida de San Bruno. Dos veces se le pidió que fuera un obispo. La primera vez fue cuando regresaba a Reims (Francia) después de un grave conflicto con el obispo lo llevó a dejar. La gente que lo conocía tan bien, su servicio dedicado y humildad solicitaron que se convierte en su obispo. Él los rechazó a su gran consternación. La segunda vez fue cuando fue llamado a Roma por su antiguo alumno que fue elegido Papa, Urbano II. Aceptó el papel de ser un asesor papal, pero declinó la oferta para ser ordenado obispo, un rango y título que normalmente van a la oficina de un asesor papal.

La mitra, el personal y el anillo habría sido impresionantes símbolos de sus logros, un testimonio de su intelecto superior y una prueba de su profunda espiritualidad. Habría sido colocado en esa posición única de la autoridad. La gente se arrodilló delante de él, besar su anillo y se dirigen a él con títulos elevados tales como "Su Excelencia" o "Reverendo". San Bruno no quiso saber nada de ellos. Prefirió en cambio la vida de un ermitaño. Su estatua en lugares bien visibles en el vestíbulo habla bien de la humildad de San Bruno. Su cabeza está inclinada. Tan humilde es este hombre que ni siquiera se atrevió a mirar hacia arriba.

San Bruno observó una vida simple. Él vivió en una ermita con una habitación simple, una cama y una mesa. Él no comía carne ni bebía alcohol. Trabajó duro, leía mucho y rezaba mucho. A intervalos regulares, rezó con sus compañeros monjes: se levantaba a media noche, las 5:30 de la mañana, al mediodía, 3 y las 6 de la tarde.

Lunes, 7 de octubre, es la fiesta de María bajo su título de Nuestra Señora del Rosario. San Bruno tenía un profundo amor y cariño a María. Recemos el rosario, si es posible todos los días, por la paz, de la armonía de la seguridad global. Vamos a ser inspirados por San Bruno, que nunca dejó de dejar de orar. Deje que nuestra parroquia sea una comunidad orante.

Querido San Bruno, ayudanos a vivir una vida de humildad, sencillez y oración. Que la Eucaristía para la que tenía un profundo afecto nos acerque a Cristo y el uno al otro Amen.

Estoy feliz de dar la bienvenida a nuestra parroquia a los jóvenes artistas *Mga Anak ni Inang Daigdig* de Smokey Mountain, de Manila, donde el Padre Ben Beltrán trabajó durante muchos años. El grupo llevará a cabo una serie de conciertos en el Área de la Bahía que muestran la riqueza del patrimonio cultural filipino a través de danzas y rituales. El grupo presentará una muestra en nuestro festival. Ellos están programados para hacer una presentación en el Colegio de Skyline el 12 de octubre a las 2PM y a las 7PM.
