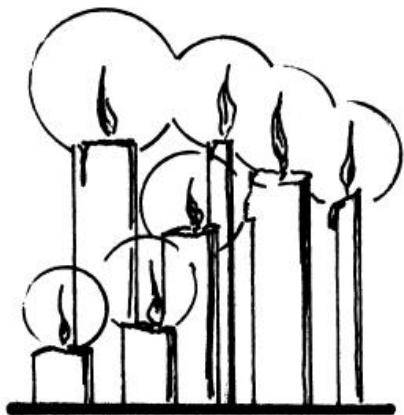


Saint Bruno Church

101

101 is the freeway that runs through the states of California, Oregon, and Washington. 101 is also the beginning of book titles and website postings that describe or list items such as "101 Things to Do when you are Bored". Course 101, on the other hand, implies an overview of a subject matter or topic as in "Spanish Language Course 101". Subsequent courses "102" and "103" build on that.

As the title of this article, however, 101 refers to the number of years since the foundation of the parish. Yep, last year was our centennial and this year St. Bruno's reaches "one oh one." Did you know that the parish was established before the city? Yep, before there was a city of San Bruno there was already a church of St. Bruno. December 2014 is the centennial celebration of the city of San Bruno. Ours was October 2012. We are ahead by two years.

Credit that to the grit, determination and faith of Frs. Grant, Cantwell, Heverin and others. Their pioneering spirit and missionary zeal brought us to where we are now. Let us gratefully remember them today as we celebrate World Mission Sunday.

Many, if not all of us, owe our Catholic Christian faith to missionaries. The pioneering priests of my home diocese were Spanish Dominicans. My vocation to the priesthood was awakened and nurtured by German Divine Word missionaries. My seminary formation was administered by Belgian Immaculate Heart of Mary missionaries. These are men and women who willingly left the comfort and security of their countries to bring the message of Christ's love to the whole world.

As we celebrate our 101st anniversary, let us seriously consider becoming a mission-sending church; that we do not only help the missions with our prayers and monetary contributions but develop missionaries from among us, especially the youth. Yes, we are comparatively a poor parish but there is a wealth of talent, good will and energy among us. Wouldn't it be wonderful if 3-5 years down the road we have parishioners in the seminaries, convents and in mission countries? On this World Mission Sunday, let us commit ourselves to becoming a mission-sending parish.

Did you know that "101" is a palindrome? A palindrome is a number, word or phrase that reads the same backward. 101 reads the same backward. Flip it over, it remains the same.

Here is an imaginary conversation between our first parents:

He: (seeing Eve for the first time was so taken up by her beauty) Wow!

She: (expressing surprise) Huh?

He: (ever a gentleman introduces self) Madam, I'm Adam.

She: (shyly) Eve.

101 es la carretera que pasa por los estados de California, Oregon y Washington. 101 es también el comienzo de los títulos de libros y publicaciones en sitios Web que describen o enumeran artículos como "101 cosas que hacer cuando estás aburrido". Curso 101, por otro lado, implica una visión general de un tema o tópico como en "Curso 101 de español". Cursos posteriores "102" y "103" se basan a ello.

Como el título de este artículo, sin embargo, 101 se refiere al número de años transcurridos desde la fundación de la parroquia. Sí, el año pasado fue el centenario y este año San Bruno llega a "uno oh uno".

Al celebrar nuestro 101 aniversario, vamos a considerar seriamente convertirnos en una iglesia de misión - el envío, para que nosotros no solo ayudamos a la actividad misionera con la oración y aportes monetarios, sino desarrollar misioneros entre nosotros, especialmente los jóvenes. Sí, estamos en una parroquia pobre, pero hay una gran cantidad de talento, la buena voluntad y la energía entre nosotros. ¿No sería maravilloso si 3-5 años en el camino que tenemos feligreses en los seminarios, conventos y en los países de misión? En esta Jornada Misionera Mundial, vamos a comprometernos a convertirnos en una parroquia de misión envío.

Our parish was recently blessed with a visit from youth performers, who were born and grew up in Smokey Mountain (the third largest untreated garbage dump in the world, where Father Ben Beltran served for many years). Mga Anak ni Inang Daigdig, "Children of Mother Earth", are global ambassadors for peace and the environment, bringing a message to increase the awareness of the global poverty and climate change. Their goal is to raise enough funds to plant 1,000,000 trees over five years.

Perhaps their greatest impact on many parishioners, who came in contact with them, was the climate change within our own hearts and the seeds that were planted to help us to grow in gratitude, forgiveness, and finding beauty even among the garbage that surrounds us in our daily lives.

The night that their possessions were stolen from their van, they gathered and sang "Lift Up Your Hands". They offered forgiveness for the people who took their things, praised God for their daily blessings, and thanked God for their safety and wellbeing. Amazingly, not one prayer was mentioned asking God to return their things, yet He replenished all that they lost and more.

"Lord, thank you for the beauty that surrounds me, even in unlikely places. I ask not for material possessions, but rather for you to grow in me a heart of gratitude, compassion, forgiveness, charity, stewardship, and fortitude. Amen."
