The Book

A grandfather sitting in a wicker chair tells his grandson, "Sonny, give me the book."

The boy went to the bookcase, turned to the old man and said, "Which book, grandpa? You have so many of them."

The grandfather replied, "Sonny, there is only one book, the bible."

The bible is a book. Actually it is a compendium of books, a book made of many books, 73 of them. It's a virtual library. It has two authors; one divine, the other human. The bible is written by God and human beings. God used persons to inscribe his messages for us. This is called divine inspiration. The authors did not write what they wanted but what God told them to write. The comparison is the hand holding a pen. The pen is the person; the hand that moves the pen is God.

Since the bible is a book, it has to be read. It is nice and becoming to give a prominent place to the bible in our houses to draw attention to its exceptional value but if it is only there for display, if is not opened and read, it becomes just a piece of decoration. Again, as a book it has to be read.

Why read the bible? Why is it so important? One word: revelation. In the bible, God reveals Himself to us. He takes the initiative to relate with us. God desires to enter into a personal relationship with us and so he reveals Himself to us. The bible is the record of that revelation. That self-revelation of God invites a human response which we call Faith. The result is the formation of a people bound to God and to each other. The bible forms us into a believing community.

The Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation (Dei Verbum), the Vatican II document on the Scriptures, tells us a lot. For one, it emphasizes on the role of the Holy Spirit in understanding the Scriptures. Thus, it strongly encourages every Catholic to read and study the bible prayerfully confident in the guidance of the Holy Spirit. It basically says that the bible is not reserved for the scholars but it is for everyone.

If we could get families, ministries, committees and communities to read the Sunday readings each week before they come to mass, we'd see dramatic changes in our parish. Bible-sharing is one way to do it. This refers to a group of 4-8 people who listen to the Word of God, prayerfully reflect on it and try to put the message they get into practice. How to go about it? The group finds a quiet place, sit in a circle around a lighted candle that symbolizes Christ. Someone reads the gospel (of the coming Sunday). Others listen. A period of silence follows. Then the leader directs the sharing of reflections based on guide questions which the parish provides. The session ends with a prayer. It takes 45-60 minutes. If we can do this regularly, say once in two weeks, our love for the scriptures deepen, our bonding as small groups intensifies and our connection to the parish is strengthened. In short, our faith and commitment are deepened.

El Libro

Un abuelo sentado en una silla de mimbre le dice a su nieto, "Sonny, dame el libro. "

El muchacho fue a la estantería, se voltio hacia el anciano y dijo: "¿Qué libro, abuelo? Usted tiene muchos de ellos".

El abuelo respondió: " Sonny, sólo hay un libro, la Biblia. "

La Biblia es un libro. En realidad se trata de un compendio de libros, un libro hecho de muchos libros, 73 de ellos. Es una biblioteca virtual. Dispone de dos autores, uno divino, el otro ser humano. La Biblia fue escrita por Dios y los seres humanos. Dios usa personas para inscribir sus mensajes para nosotros. Esto se llama la inspiración divina. Los autores no escriben lo que quieren sino lo que Dios les dijo que escribir. La comparación es la mano que sostiene una pluma. La pluma es la persona, y la mano que mueve la pluma es Dios.

Puesto que la Biblia es un libro, hay que leerlo. Es agradable y se ha convertido muy prominente tener la Biblia en nuestras casas para llamar la atención a su valor excepcional, pero si sólo está allí para mostrar, si no está abierto y leído, se convierte en sólo un pedazo de decoración. Una vez más, como un libro que tiene que ser leído.

¿Por qué leer la Biblia? ¿Por qué es tan importante? En una palabra: la revelación. En la Biblia, Dios se revela a nosotros. Toma la iniciativa para relacionarse con nosotros. Dios desea entrar en una relación personal con nosotros y así que él se revela a nosotros. La Biblia es el registro de esa revelación. Esa auto-revelación de Dios invita a una respuesta humana que llamamos fe. El resultado es la formación de un pueblo unidos a Dios y el uno al otro. La biblia nos forma en una comunidad de creyentes.

La Constitución Dogmática sobre la Divina Revelación (Dei Verbum), el documento del Vaticano II sobre las Escrituras, nos dice mucho. Por un lado, se hace hincapié en el papel del Espíritu Santo en la comprensión de las Escrituras. Así, se recomienda encarecidamente a todos los católicos a leer y estudiar la Biblia con oración confiada en la guía del Espíritu Santo. Básicamente dice que la Biblia no está reservado para los estudiosos, sino que es para todo el mundo.

Si pudiéramos conseguir familias, ministerios, comités y comunidades para leer las lecturas del domingo de cada semana antes de que vengan a misa, nos gustaría ver cambios dramáticos en nuestra parroquia. - Compartir la Biblia es una manera de hacerlo. Esto se refiere a un grupo de 4-8 personas que escuchan la Palabra de Dios, reflexionar en oración sobre ella y tratar de poner el mensaje que se meten en la práctica. ¿Cómo hacerlo? El grupo encuentra un lugar tranquilo, se sientan en un círculo alrededor de una vela encendida que simboliza a Cristo. Alguien lee el evangelio (del próximo domingo). Otros escuchan. Un momento de silencio sigue. Entonces el líder dirige las reflexiones a partir de preguntas de guía que la parroquia ofrece. La sesión termina con una oración. Se tarda 45-60 minutos. Si podemos hacer esto de forma regular, por ejemplo, una vez cada dos semanas, nuestro amor por las Escrituras profundizara nuestra unión como los grupos pequeños se intensifica y nuestra conexión con la parroquia y se fortalece. En resumen, nuestra fe y compromiso se profundizan.

"REJOICE WITH JOYFUL SONG"

With almost childlike eagerness today's scriptures proclaim: "Here is your God . . . he comes to save you" (Isaiah 35:4); "the coming of the Lord is at hand" (James 5:8); "Are you the one who is to come?"
