Resurrexit

Resurrexit! He is risen! Today is victory Sunday! Today is about life, dignity and joy. It calls for a celebration. Gather around the table as family, as friends and as fellow believers. Celebrate life. Celebrate the joy of being together. Celebrate the love God has for us that he conquered for us the most formidable opponent – death itself. We are champions and we should think, speak and behave as such.

Resurrexit sicut dixit, alleluia!" He is risen as he has said, alleluia! These words conjure in my mind beautiful images of yesteryears. On early Easter Sunday morning, just as the sun breaks through the mountains, a young girl dressed as an angel is lowered on a contraption from a high perch above the statue of the sorrowful Mother and ever so gingerly takes hold of the mourning veil and pulls it up and away revealing her lovely face and her resplendent sky-blue garment. This is followed with gasps of oohs and aahs, clapping, laughter and shouts of alleluia. Meanwhile the bearers of the statue of the Blessed Mother and that of the Risen Lord maneuver the carrying poles that support the images into an up-and-down, side-to-side motion giving the appearance that the statues are swaying and dancing. Everyone follows suit; the men who came into that meeting place (encuentro) following the statue of the Risen Lord and the women who followed the statue of Mary. Then the two groups merge and form a single procession to the church for the Easter Sunday morning mass.

Resurrexit. I attended last Tuesday, the ecumenical gathering between the Archdiocese of San Francisco led by Archbishop Cordileone and the Greek Orthodox Metropolis led by Metropolitan Gerasimos. The event which took place at Holy Cross Orthodox Church in Belmont was a preparation for the meeting of Pope Francis and Patriarch Bartholomew in Jerusalem next month in commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the meeting of the respective predecessors, Pope Paul VI and Patriarch Athenagoras.

In speaking about the significance of the event, his eminence Gerasimos was clear and concise. He ended with an anecdote. After the historic meeting with Paul VI, Athenagoras was asked what took the church leaders so long to come together. The patriarch is alleged to have said that after 500 years, it was time for the pope and the patriarch to say "good morning" to each another. That elicited laughter. Then the Metropolitan continued, "and in that spirit, I greet you Archbishop Cordileone, 'Good evening!'" What a nice ending.

Resurrexit! ¡Ha resucitado! Hoy es Domingo de victoria! Hoy se trata de la vida, la dignidad y la alegría. Esto merece una celebración. Se reúnen alrededor de la mesa, como familia, como amigos y como hermanos en la fe. Celebrar la vida. Celebre la alegría de estar juntos. Celebre el amor que Dios tiene para nosotros que él conquistó para nosotros el oponente más formidable - la muerte misma. Somos campeones y tenemos que pensar, hablar y comportarse como tal.

Dixit sicut Resurrexit, aleluya! "¡Ha resucitado como él ha dicho, aleluya! Estas palabras evocan en mi mente imágenes hermosas de antaño. En la madrugada del Domingo de Pascua, justo cuando el sol se rompe a través de las montañas, una joven vestida como un ángel se baja en un artilugio de una percha alta por encima de la estatua de la Madre dolorosa y tan cautelosamente se apodera del velo de luto y tira lo que revela hacia arriba y lejos de su cara bonita y su resplandeciente prenda de color azul celeste. Esto es seguido con exclamaciones de asombro y, aplausos, risas y gritos de aleluya. Mientras tanto, los portadores de la estatua de la Santísima Virgen y la del Señor Resucitado maniobran las varas que apoyan las imágenes en una, movimiento hacia arriba y hacia abajo de lado a lado dando la apariencia de que las estatuas se mecen y baile. Todo el mundo hace lo mismo; los hombres que vinieron a ese punto de encuentro, tras la imagen del Señor Resucitado y las mujeres que siguieron a la estatua de María. A continuación, los dos grupos se unen y forman una sola procesión a la iglesia para la misa del Domingo de Pascua por la mañana.

Resurrexit. Asistí el pasado martes, el encuentro ecuménico entre la Arquidiócesis de San Francisco dirigido por el arzobispo Cordileone y el Metropolis Ortodoxa Griega Metropolitana dirigido por Gerasimos. El evento que tuvo lugar en la iglesia ortodoxa de la Santa Cruz en Belmont era una preparación para el encuentro del Papa Francisco y el Patriarca Bartolomé en Jerusalén el próximo mes en conmemoración del 50 aniversario de la reunión de los respectivos predecesores, el Papa Pablo VI y el Patriarca Atenágoras.

Al hablar de la importancia del evento, su eminencia Gerasimos fue claro y conciso. Terminó con una anécdota. Después de la histórica reunión con Pablo VI, Atenágoras se le preguntó lo que llevó a los líderes de la iglesia tanto en venir juntos. Se alega que el patriarca de haber dicho que después de 500 años, ya era hora de que el Papa y el patriarca de decir "buenos días" a cada uno otro. Eso suscitó la risa. A continuación, el Metropolitan continuó, "y en ese espíritu, te saludo arzobispo Cordileone, "¡Buenas noches!" "Lo que un buen final.

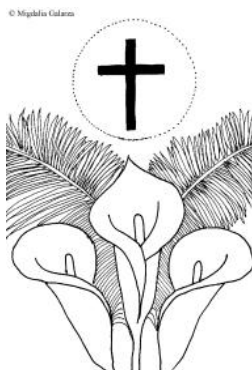


Our Parish will be hosting a Catholic Book and Media Fair

SO WHAT?

The lesson the Gospel presents to us today is consistent with the entire Gospel of Jesus: there is a certain "upside-downness" to the life of a disciple of Jesus. The first are last, the last are first. It does not matter who "wins" but rather that all believe. It matters that all hear the original witness of Mary Magdalene that the tomb is, indeed, empty. It matters that this news--that death will not win--excites us so much that we cannot help but run with joy and disbelief to learn this lesson ourselves, to come to believe in it, and to share it all around, as Peter does in his testimony from the Acts of the Apostles. As disciples, we needn't worry about whether or not we can run the fastest. What we need to be concerned about is that we hear the message, get to the empty tomb, see, believe, and then proclaim the Good News of Christ raised from the dead.
