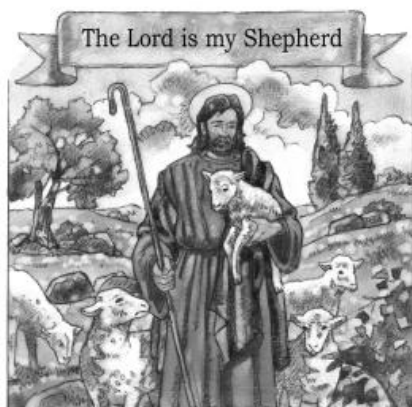


Saint Bruno Church

Mother

My mother is the second of three children, all girls. When she was born, her mother Manuela did something totally unexpected. She gave away her firstborn to her cousin Dalli who was without a child. As was recounted to me, when my grandmother handed her child to my grandaunt she said, "*Cousin, here is a clean and pure gift. She is yours. From now on you are the mother.*" My aunt's name was Natividad which means "birth." To mark that important family event and that presentation, my mother was called Presentacion. Later when my grandmother Manuela gave birth again, her third and last, she had the child baptized Generosa in recognition of God's generosity. Generosa is the mother of my cousin Cynthia. True her word, my grandmother Manuela never interfered with the care and nurturing of Natividad and my grandaunt Dalli was a most loving and caring mother. So my mother and her sisters grew up in separate households which in no way diminished their bonding and closeness. They had great relationship and looked after each other so much so that they were fondly called the "three sisters." Such was their closeness that their maternal concern extended to all their children. In a sense, my cousins and I did not have one but three mothers.

One day, when my brother Val came home crying from a teacher's scolding, my mother lost no time in seeking out the offending teacher and promptly gave her a verbal thrashing. Soon word got around that no one meshes up with the children of "Maestra Pensing" and gets away with it. I had an inborn heart defect and at nineteen, I needed surgery. The cost of the operation, however, was beyond what my parents could afford so I was referred to the Social Security Department for discounted fee. I was shocked and embarrassed when my mother, a proud and strong woman, broke down in tears before the social worker begging for a huge discount. She must have done a good job for, indeed, we were given a sizeable discount. So I went through a high-risk surgery at an affordable rate and I survived. Thanks to a large degree to my mom.

I could go on extolling my mother but I'm sure you get my drift. Today is Mother's Day. Thank God for your mother. Thank God for the caring and loving mother that you have or once had. Be kind and tender to them. And to those who never experienced the love of a mother, fly to the loving arms of the Blessed Mother. There you find peace, comfort and security.

Here's a prayer for Mother's Day:

Loving God, as a mother gives life and nourishment to her children,
so you watch over your Church. Bless these women, that they may be strengthened as Christian mothers. Let the example of their faith and love shine forth. Grant that we, their sons and daughters, may honor them always with a spirit of profound respect.
Grant this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Madre

Mi madre es el segundo de tres hijos, todas las niñas. Cuando nació, su madre Manuela hizo algo totalmente inesperado. Ella regaló su primera hija con su prima Dalli que estaba sin un niño. Como me lo ha contado, cuando mi abuela le entregó a su hijo a mi tía abuela dijo, "Prima, aquí tienes un regalo limpio y puro. Es tuya. A partir de ahora tu eres la madre." El nombre de mi tía era Natividad, que significa "nacimiento". Para conmemorar ese acontecimiento familiar importante y que la presentación, mi madre se llamaba Presentacion. Más tarde, cuando mi abuela Manuela dio a luz otra vez, su tercera y última, bautizo a la niña Generosa en reconocimiento a la generosidad de Dios. Generosa es la madre de mi prima Cynthia. Cumplió su palabra, mi abuela Manuela nunca interfirió con el cuidado y la crianza de Natividad y mi tía abuela Dalli era una madre amorosa y cariñosa. Así que mi madre y sus hermanas crecieron en hogares separados, que de ninguna manera disminuían su vinculación y cercanía. Tenían gran relación y cuidados entre sí hasta tal punto que se les llaman cariñosamente las "tres hermanas". Tal era la cercanía que su preocupación maternal extendía a todos sus hijos. En cierto sentido, mis primos y yo no teníamos una, sino tres madres.

Un día, cuando mi hermano Val llegó a casa llorando por reñagos de un profesor, mi madre no perdió tiempo en la búsqueda de la maestra y rápidamente le dio una paliza verbal. Pronto se corrió la voz de que nadie se engrana con los hijos de "Maestra dispensadora" y sale con la suya.

Yo tenía un defecto cardíaco congénito y a los diecinueve años, necesitaba una cirugía. El costo de la operación, sin embargo, fue más allá de lo que mis padres podían pagar lo que me enviaron con el Departamento de Seguridad Social para recibir una tarifa con descuento. Me quedé muy sorprendido y avergonzado cuando mi madre, una mujer orgullosa y fuerte, rompió en llanto ante el trabajador social pidiendo un descuento enorme. Ella debe haber hecho un buen trabajo porque, de hecho, nos dieron un descuento considerable. Así que me fui a través de una cirugía de alto riesgo a un precio asequible y sobreviví. Gracias en gran medida a mi mamá.

Podría seguir y en ensalzar a mi madre, pero estoy seguro de que me entienden. Hoy es el Día de la Madres. Gracias a Dios por su madre. Gracias a Dios por la madre cariñosa y amorosa que usted tiene o alguna vez tuvo. Sea amable y tierno con ellos. Y a aquellos que nunca han experimentado el amor de una madre, volar a los brazos amorosos de la Santísima Madre. Allí se encuentra la paz, la comodidad y la seguridad.

Aquí hay una oración para el Día de la Madre:

Amar a Dios, como una madre le da vida y alimento a sus hijos, por lo que ver más de tu Iglesia. Bendice a estas mujeres, que sean fortalecidos como madres cristianas. Que el ejemplo de su fe y amor brille. Concede que nosotros, sus hijos e hijas, podamos honrarlos siempre con un espíritu de profundo respeto. Te lo pedimos por Cristo nuestro Señor. Amén.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES CYO

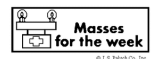

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TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Every rectory office has received a panicked phone call from a person who has been invited to serve as a godparent, or from someone newly engaged, who suddenly "needs to get confirmed." While the lack of confirmation is not an obstacle for marriage, it is for godparenting. Many are surprised that the Church seems to be looking for a kind of sacramental "seal" on one's baptism before the door opens fully to this ministry. Yet if you think about it, would you want someone to guide you to a place that he or she had not yet been? A godparent has to be someone who has "been there" and knows the way.

Although signet rings and wax seals have passed from use, our society depends on "seals of approval" ranging from certificates of quality to the familiar safety seals on medicines and foods. While Eucharist is the "seal" of the sacrament of baptism, there is a sense in which one's Christian initiation is also incomplete without confirmation. Have you been confirmed?
