Pledge Sunday

Everything that we have comes from God. Our life, health, work, property, achievements, families and friends are gifts from God. The only thing that belongs to us is our sins.

Once we realize this, our response should be to "give thanks". This is done in many ways: by developing our talents, by celebrating the Eucharist (it means thanksgiving) and by giving back to God a portion of what He has given us.

Here at St. Bruno's, we have defined what "giving back" means. It starts on a Pledge Sunday which is today. On this day we pledge to set aside a portion of our earnings in thanksgiving to God "for all that we are and all that we have." We put down our pledges into cards and present them to the altar.

In making a pledge kindly remember the 3 P's: priority, percentage and progressive. The pledge comes first before paying bills and other expense allocation. Second, consider giving a percentage rather than a fixed amount. Zacchaeus gave 50% of his possessions. We are not asked to give that but maybe 4% is a good place to start. Third, it is progressive. We gradually increase the pledged amount once we find the original pledge doable.

What's the difference between pledge-giving and simply dropping cash in the collection basket? Two words: belongingness and commitment. By using the pledge card, we make ourselves known. We are no longer strangers. We are part of the family. We belong.

Second, making a pledge is an act of commitment. We acknowledge the beauty and rightfulness of giving back to God what He has given us. It is the end result of a well-thought out process. Our giving is the consequence of prayerful, mature decision; not based on mood or feeling which are temporary. The recommended frequency towards the fulfillment of pledges is monthly, not weekly. This is less hassle than a weekly basis and it is also easier for record-keeping. In recognition of the Tongan tradition of annual church fundraiser, we will also take that into consideration "at one time" fulfillment of pledges. Happy pledge-giving!

Thanks to all for your participation at the recent festival. The food was plentiful. The presentations were awesome. The camaraderie was great. The funds raised was more than expected. Through the intercession of St. Bruno, may God bless us and our families always!

Next Sunday is World Mission Sunday. The collection will go to Mongolia, the youngest church in the world. The bishop there, Bp. Wenceslao "Wens" Padilla, CICM, was my prefect in the college seminary. When he arrived there in 1992 as a missionary priest, there was no church building at all and there was not a single Mongolian Catholic. He and his missionary companions started from zero. Let us help Bishop Wens in building up the church in that corner of the world.

Domingo de Promesa

Todo lo que tenemos viene de Dios. Nuestra vida, la salud, el trabajo, la propiedad, los logros, las familias y los amigos son un regalo de Dios. Lo único que nos pertenece son nuestros pecados.

Una vez que nos damos cuenta de esto, nuestra respuesta debe ser la de "dar gracias". Esto se hace de muchas maneras: mediante el desarrollo de nuestros talentos, con la celebración de la Eucaristía (que significa acción de gracias) y por devolver a Dios una parte de lo que Él nos ha dado.

Aquí en San Bruno, que hemos definido lo que "devolver" significa. Comienza en Domingo de Promesa que es hoy. En este día nos comprometemos a dejar de lado una parte de nuestros ingresos en acción de gracias a Dios "por todo lo que somos y todo lo que tenemos." Ponemos por nuestras promesas en las tarjetas y los presentamos al altar.

Al hacer una promesa recordemos lo siguiente prioridad, porcentaje y progresiva. El compromiso es lo primero antes de pagar las cuentas y otras asignaciones de gastos. En segundo lugar, considere la posibilidad de un porcentaje en lugar de una cantidad fija. Zaqueo dio el 50% de sus posesiones. No se nos pide dar eso, pero tal vez el 4% es un buen lugar para empezar. Tercero, es progresiva. Poco a poco aumentamos la cantidad prometida una vez nos encontramos con la promesa original factible.

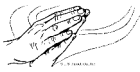
¿Cuál es la diferencia entre la promesa y más que soltar dinero en efectivo en la canasta de la colecta? Dos palabras: pertenencia y compromiso. Mediante el uso de la tarjeta de compromiso, nos damos a conocer. Somos extranjeros ya no importa. Somos parte de la familia. Nosotros pertenecemos.

En segundo lugar, hacer una promesa es un acto de compromiso. Reconocemos la belleza y la legitimidad de devolver a Dios lo que Él nos ha dado. Es el resultado final de un proceso bien pensado. Nuestro dar es la consecuencia de la decisión de oración, maduro; no se basa en el estado de ánimo o sentimiento que son temporales.

La frecuencia recomendada para el cumplimiento de las promesas es mensual, no semanal. Esto es menos problemas que una vez por semana y también es más fácil para el mantenimiento de registros. En reconocimiento a la tradición de Tonga de recaudación de fondos anual de la iglesia, también vamos a tomar eso en consideración "a la vez" el cumplimiento de las promesas. Feliz promesa que da!

Gracias a todos por su participación en el festival reciente. La comida era abundante. Las presentaciones eran impresionantes. La camaradería fue genial. Los fondos recaudados fue más de lo esperado. A través de la intercesión de San Bruno, que Dios nosotros y nuestras familias bendiga siempre!

We are so blessed to have the Missionaries of Charity serving our parish. They are starting 3 innovative programs this week:



PRE-SCHOOL CCD PROGRAM for children ages 3-5 Saturday mornings 9-11AM. This program introduces young children to the Catholic Faith through a Montessori approach. They are already able to develop a very real and personal relationship with God the Father through His Son - the Good Shepherd - in the Holy Spirit. You will be amazed to discover their great potential for communion with God at this tender age.

OUR LADY OF FATIMA CHILDREN'S GROUP after school program for children ages 6-13. Tuesday afternoons 3:30-5:30PM. This group is designed to further form and nurture children's relationship with God in the community of the Church. Together, we will prepare for **TOTAL CONSECRATION TO JESUS THROUGH MARY** using music, devotions, liturgy, games and art.

FIRST-YEAR CONFIRMATION program for 8th-grade and up. Tuesdays 4-5:30PM followed by 6PM Mass. These students will participate in all the first year Confirmation requirements of learning to serve at mass, the Creed, earning service hours, participation in retreats, and activities. Upon successful completion, they will be eligible for second year Confirmation class.

The Good Shepherd program requires parent sign in and out, and permission slips. The Fatima program requires parental permission slip. And the First year Confirmation program requires a registration application. All paperwork is available in our parish office.

Please spread the word amongst your family and friends to "evangelize" the entire community.



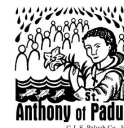

St. Anthony's Relics Visit

Northern California

October 26 - November 2



St. Anthony will be visiting us in the form of a precious relic from his Basilica in Padua, Italy. The relic will be accompanied by a Franciscan Friar from the Messenger of St. Anthony.

St Anthony of Padua: Born 15 August 1195 Lisbon, Portugal Died 13 June 1231 (aged 35) Padua, Italy

Anthony of Padua was a Portuguese Catholic friar belonging to the Franciscan Order. He was born and raised in a wealthy family in Lisbon. Noted by his contemporaries for his forceful preaching and expert knowledge of scripture, he was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church in 1946. St Anthony was canonized a year after his death. His remains are kept in the Basilica in Padua, Italy. When St Bonaventure presided over the opening of Anthony's coffin in 1263, he discovered that the Saint's vocal organs were intact, including a red and soft tongue. "Oh blessed tongue that ever praised the Lord and led others to praise Him!" St Bonaventure exclaimed, adding, "Now we can clearly see how great indeed have been your merits before God."

Visita de las Reliquias de San Antonio de Padua

San Antonio nos visita en la forma de una preciosa reliquia de su Basilica en Padua, Italia. La reliquia estará acompañada por un fraile franciscano del Mensajero de San Antonio.

San Antonio de Padua: Nació 15 de agosto 1195 Lisboa, Portugal Murió 13 de junio 1231 (35 años) Padua, Italia

Antonio de Padua fue un fraile católico portugués perteneciente a la Orden Franciscana. Nació y se crió en una familia acomodada en Lisboa. Conocido por sus contemporáneos por su predicación fuerte y experto conocimiento de las Escrituras, fue proclamado Doctor de la Iglesia en 1946, San Antonio fue canonizado un año después de su muerte. Sus restos se conservan en la Basilica en Padua, Italia. Cuando St Bonaventure presidió la apertura del ataúd de Anthony en 1263, descubrió que los órganos vocales del Santo estaban intactos, incluyendo una lengua roja y suave. "Oh lengua bendita que nunca alabó al Señor y condujo a otros a alabarlo! "St Bonaventure exclamó, y añadió, " Ahora podemos ver claramente cuán grande es de hecho han sido sus méritos ante Dios ".
