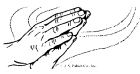

Catechism Corner



As we reflect on the beautiful Christmas season, and make resolutions to improve our lives, we realize that we want to become better Catholics. Only the Catholic Church was started by Jesus Himself, handed down through apostolic succession and possesses the fullness of truth. We cannot "buy" our way to heaven, but we can through faith and works, be the people God wants us to be. So let us plan to use the corporal works of mercy to our advantage in storing up heavenly treasure. We can start with "instructing the ignorant" and "counseling the doubtful" : that is ourselves. Once we learn more of basic bible timelines and salvation history, we can share this with family, and friends who may be away from the church. We cannot give what we do not have. If we ourselves are ignorant of basic bible knowledge, we cannot hope to follow our Lord and "evangelize" all nations.

So plan on attending our annual bible study for all levels of understanding. It is largely video with handouts so even with Basic English, one can understand the concepts. It starts Jan.17 through Feb.28 on Saturdays at 9:30-11:00am in the church. Bring a friend or family member. It is free and open to all.
