Extraordinary Jubilee Year

A jubilee year is a special year called by the church to receive blessing and pardon from God and remission of sins. The Catholic Church has called jubilee years every 25 or 50 years since the year **1300**. The last jubilee year was in 2000 which I remember very well for I was pretty new then in San Francisco. The jubilee year mass of the Archdiocese was held at the then recently-opened Pacific Bell Park, now known as AT & T Park. It was my first time to be at the spacious stadium and I was so overwhelmed. More impressive was the coming together of all the parishes of the Archdiocese to celebrate the jubilee mass.

From time to time, the Church calls for special jubilee year known as extraordinary jubilee years. Last Sunday, Feast of the Divine Mercy, Pope Francis officially proclaimed 2016 as a jubilee year of mercy. It starts on December 8 this year, the feast of the Immaculate Conception and also the fiftieth anniversary of the closing of the Second Vatican Council, and ends on the feast of Christ the King, November 20, 2016.

In proclaiming the jubilee year, the Holy Father calls on the entire Catholic Church to "refashion itself as a place not of judgment or condemnation but of pardon and merciful love." He states that the church's "credibility is seen in how she shows merciful and compassionate love" and urged everyone "to return to the basics and to bear the weaknesses and struggles of our brothers and sisters." The pontiff explains, "Mercy is the force that reawakens us to new life and instills in us the courage to look to the future with hope." Those are heavy and powerful words that should make everyone seriously consider how to turn them into concrete actions.

When he first mentioned the Jubilee Year of Mercy last month, Pope Francis indicated what it entails. He wants this jubilee to go deeper into spirituality and be a far-reaching Christian witness of mercy to the world. The focus is not so much on grand celebrations as much as concrete initiatives of mercy. The Holy Father continues to remind us that at the end of our life we will be judged by how we treated others (Matthew 25:31-46).

In observance of this the Year of Consecrated Life, we are pleased to have with us Sr. Soledad Hernandez, a Carmelite nun who lived a monastic life for 40 years. I met Sr. Soledad in the patio of St. Dominic Church in Oaxaca, Mexico, last year. She was walking out with the aid of a cane and I was walking in (actually limping as I had gout). When she saw me in my condition she offered the use of her cane which I politely declined. That's how we got to know each other. She will speak at all the masses.

Año Jubilar Extraordinario

Un año jubilar es un año especial convocada por la iglesia para recibir la bendición y el perdón de Dios y el perdón de los pecados. La Iglesia Católica ha llamado el año del jubileo cada 25 o 50 años desde el año 1300. El pasado jubileo fue en el 2000, que recuerdo muy bien porque yo tenía poco en San Francisco. La misa del año jubilar de la Arquidiócesis se celebró en el entonces recientemente inaugurado Pacific Bell Park, ahora se conoce como AT&T Park. Fue mi primera vez sea en el amplio estadio y yo estaba tan abrumado. Más impresionante fue la unión de todas las parroquias de la Arquidiócesis para celebrar la misa jubilar.

De vez en cuando, la Iglesia pide el año jubilar especial conocido como extraordinarios años jubilares. El Domingo pasado, fiesta de la Divina Misericordia, el Papa Francisco proclamó oficialmente 2016 como año jubilar de la misericordia. Se inicia el 8 de Diciembre de este año, la fiesta de la Inmaculada Concepción y también el quincuagésimo aniversario de la clausura del Concilio Vaticano II, y termina en la fiesta de Cristo Rey, el 20 de Noviembre del 2016.

Al proclamar el año jubilar, el Santo Padre pide a toda la Iglesia Católica a "remodelar como un lugar no de juicio o condenación, sino de perdón y de amor misericordioso." Afirma que "la credibilidad de la iglesia se ve en cómo se muestra misericordioso y amor compasivo "e instó a todos" para volver a lo básico y soportar las flaquezas y las luchas de nuestros hermanos y hermanas". El pontífice explica: "La misericordia es la fuerza que nos despierta a una nueva vida e infunde en nosotros el coraje de mirar al futuro con esperanza". Esas son palabras fuertes y poderosas que deben hacer todas las personas seriamente estudiar la forma de convertirlos en acciones concretas.

La primera vez que se menciona el Año Jubilar el mes pasado, el Papa Francisco indicó lo que conlleva. Él quiere este jubileo para profundizar en la espiritualidad y ser un testimonio cristiano de largo alcance de la misericordia para el mundo. El foco no está tanto en grandes celebraciones tanto como iniciativas concretas de misericordia. El Santo Padre continúa recordándonos que al final de nuestra vida seremos juzgados por cómo tratamos a los demás (Mateo 25: 31-46).

En observancia de este Año de la Vida Consagrada, nos complace tener con nosotros a la Hermana Soledad Hernández, una monja carmelita que vivió una vida monástica durante 40 años. Conocí a la Hermana Soledad en el patio de la iglesia de Santo Domingo en Oaxaca, México, el año pasado. Ella estaba caminando con la ayuda de un bastón y yo estaba caminando en (en realidad cojeando como tuve la gota). Cuando me vio en mi condición me ofreció el uso de su bastón que educadamente rechacé. Así es como llegamos a conocernos. Ella hablará en todas las misas.

Catechism Corner



We are welcoming Confirmation sponsors from now until the ceremony on May 17. If asked to become a sponsor, preparing a young person to celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation, consider it an honor and a privilege. You are not just agreeing to take a role in the ceremony itself, you are agreeing to a lifetime commitment.

You need to be a good role model for the candidate not just now, but in the future. All children learn by example not so much what we say, rather what we do. You are required to maintain a relationship with the student before and once confirmed. Be there to offer spiritual guidance when it is needed. And when is it needed? Almost every day, you can pray for your confirmandi, providing a layer of protection for that person. You set the example of Catholic leadership in how you lead your life. You inspire others as a witness of Catholic life by the decisions you make, and the morals you uphold. Students are watching as you say grace before meals, offer them a ride to church, by your weekly attendance at mass, by your involvement in your church. They hear the radio you listen to, watch the movies that interest you. They receive texts and social networking from you, connecting in the language of today's youth.

All interactions with Confirmation students do not have to be religious in nature. You can attend their school plays, concerts, sporting events and family occasions. Take them out to dinner or visit their Confirmation class. Also, offer to help them earn community service hours (also known as earning the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.) Participate with them in the Walk for Life, bring a dish to the homeless shelter, visit the nursing homes or donate clothing to St. Vincent de Paul. Doing some of these things, not only helps cement a lifetime relationship with a young person, but also helps us practice the gifts the Holy Spirit has given us at our own Confirmation.
