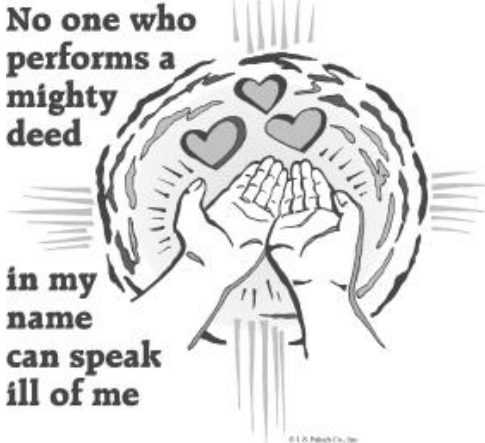

US Papal Visit II

I'm writing this column at the lobby of Marriott Hotel in Washington, D.C. at 3AM. Before you entertain any idea, however, about this ungodly hour let me hasten to add that I'm using Pacific Standard Time.

We arrived safely here in the East Coast for the canonization mass of soon-to-be declared St. Junipero Serra by Pope Francis. By "we" I mean the delegation of 150 persons including 7 priests from the Archdiocese of San Francisco headed by Fr. Moses Agudo. Mission Dolores and Epiphany have their own groups.

The ride from Dulles Airport to the hotel took 1.5 hours, a far cry to the 5-minute ride from the rectory to SFO. The weather is very pleasant, however, and the signs of early autumn of falling yellow-brownish leaves are everywhere.

Teresa Lopez, Lourdes Vega, Maria Monroy and daughter Valeria, all of St. Bruno's were in a later flight. Upon their arrival, I joined them for dinner at a nearby Mediterranean restaurant. At the table, Lourdes asked in jest, "Quien está cuidando el rebaño perdido de San Bruno, padre?" Who is taking care of the lost flock of San Bruno? I replied that the sheep of St. Bruno can take care of themselves for they are mature, disciplined and responsible. We had a good laugh at that.

Seriously, I maybe away from the parish but I carry in my heart and mind all the lovely people of St. Bruno with their concerns and worries, their joys and sorrows. I'll also include in my intentions the countries of origin of many parishioners that through the prayers of Pope Francis peace, prosperity and harmony may reign.

Since the hotel is but 2.5 miles away from Immaculate Conception Basilica, the site of the canonization, Fr. Moses suggested with the overwhelming approval of everyone that we walk to the place, praying and singing along the way. What a brilliant idea! It's also highly symbolic of the life of Serra as a missionary who undertook arduous journeys in establishing California missions.

In the plane I was re-reading Pope Francis' The Joy of the Gospel. He wrote that we are not called to be a disciple and a missionary; that the two are tied together. We are always missionary-disciples. Following Christ means a constant invitation to go, to get out of our comfort zone.

Next Sunday is our festival. I invite everyone to come and dress up in his or her native attire. I invite all men to come with hats and women in scarves. See you all!

Visita Papal II

Estoy escribiendo esta columna en el lobby del Hotel Marriott en Washington, DC a las 3AM. Antes de entretener a cualquier idea, sin embargo, acerca de esta hora intempestiva me apresuro a añadir que estoy usando la hora estándar del Pacífico.

Llegamos bien aquí en la costa este para la misa canonización de pronto-a-ser declarado San Junipero Serra por el Papa Francisco. Por "nosotros" me refiero a la delegación de 150 personas, entre ellas 7 sacerdotes de la Arquidiócesis de San Francisco dirigida por el Padre Moisés Agudo. Misión Dolores y la Epifanía tienen sus propios grupos.

El trayecto desde el aeropuerto de Dulles al hotel nos llevó 1.5 horas, nada que ver con los 5 minutos de la rectoría de la SFO. El clima es muy agradable, sin embargo, los signos de principios de otoño de la caída de las hojas de color amarillo-marrón están en todas partes.

Teresa López, Lourdes Vega, María Monroy y su hija Valeria, todos de San Bruno estaban en un vuelo posterior. A su llegada, me uní a ellos para cenar en un restaurante cercano Mediterráneo. En la mesa, Lourdes preguntó en broma, "¿Quién está cuidando el rebaño perdido de San Bruno? Le contesté que las ovejas de San Bruno se pueden cuidar de sí mismos porque son maduros, disciplinados y responsables. Nos causó risa esto.

En serio, tal vez fuera de la parroquia, pero yo llevo en mi corazón y mente todos los encantadores pueblos de San Bruno con sus inquietudes y preocupaciones, sus alegrías y tristezas. También incluiré en mis intenciones de los países de origen de muchos feligreses que a través de las oraciones de Francisco la paz, la prosperidad y la armonía reine.

Desde el hotel es sólo 2.5 millas de distancia de la Basílica de la Inmaculada Concepción, el sitio de la canonización, el Padre Moisés sugirió con la abrumadora aprobación de todo el mundo que caminamos hasta el lugar, rezando y cantando en el camino. ¡Qué brillante idea! También es altamente simbólico de la vida de Serra como misionero que llevó a cabo arduas jornadas en el establecimiento de misiones de California.

En el avión que estaba relejendo Francisco "La alegría del Evangelio". Escribió que no estamos llamados a ser discípulo y misionero; que los dos están vinculados entre sí. Siempre estamos misioneras-discípulos. Seguir a Cristo significa una invitación constante para ir, para salir de nuestra zona de confort.

El próximo domingo es nuestro festival. Invito a todos a venir y vestirse con su traje nativo. Los invito a todos a venir con los sombreros y las mujeres de las bufandas. ¡Los veo a todos!

Catechism Corner

Pope Francis calls catechesis, not a job, but a way of life. We celebrated this way of life last Sunday with Catechists from all our programs. St. Bruno's is blessed to have 10 Spanish, 14 English Catechism, 2 Tongan and 13 English Confirmation teachers and assistants. In addition, we have 4 Missionaries of Charity teaching in after-school and Confirmation programs and 2 RCIA teachers. This can potentially be an unwieldy group if we fail to realize our true purpose: to serve God by proclaiming the Good News to His people, especially the children.

To teach is to touch a life forever. Our teachers hope their legacy is grounded in compassionate evangelization, but sometimes we are human. Sometimes we place the focus on registrations, parent contact info, preparing lesson plans, the classroom set-up, or the prayer center. But we need to step away from the details and emphasize the important reason we are here: to share God's love not to cause others to sin or to lose faith. We are to live what we teach. This is a great responsibility. Please pray that nothing in our attitude toward the children or their families contradicts the Good News that we are called to proclaim.

"A faith that does not become culture (way of life) is not fully accepted, not entirely thought out, not faithfully lived. "Pope John Paul II
