I am writing to invite you to participate in the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal (AAA). As the name states, this is yearly fundraising effort to support the Archdiocese in its different ministries, programs and services.

As you consider your gift to the Appeal, please think about how your personal generosity touches many lives. The Appeal benefits the youth, the elderly, the sick the disabled, families and ethnic ministries. These ministries, programs and services are extremely important to the lives of the people living in our parish and the Archdiocese.

We have set the launching of the Archdiocesan Appeal for our parish on Mercy Sunday, April 3, Very appropriately, for the theme chosen for this year's appeal, taken from the Sermon on the Mount is on mercy: "*Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy*" (Matthew 5, 7).

The goal for AAA 2016 is \$6.4 million. The assessment for Saint Bruno Church is **\$45, 179.00**. Compared to that of last year which was \$ 37,900, it is an increase of \$ 7,279 or 19%. It's huge but I believe that what is asked of us is attainable. I ask that you consider what you can do to help with this important work. If every family participates through a sacrificial gift, we will do our fair share to help our Archdiocesan family. Rest assured, the money that exceeds our goal will be returned to the parish.

As you reflect upon the gift based on to your financial capability, please know that I am grateful to you for your sacrifice, regardless of the amount. Together as a faith community, we can make a significant difference that extends beyond the boundaries of Saint Bruno parish.

Through the intercession of the Blessed Mother and Saint Bruno, may the Lord bless you abundantly for the commitment you make to the Archdiocese.

Jubilee Year of Mercy

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Misericordiae Vultus: The Face of Mercy is Pope Francis' official decree announcing this Jubilee Year of Mercy. But Francis had already declared that Jesus "has shown the face of God's mercy" back in 2013 on his first Palm Sunday as pope. Francis described Luke's account of Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem: "Crowds, celebrating, praise, blessing, peace: joy fills the air. Jesus has awakened great hopes, especially in the hearts of the simple, the humble, the poor, the forgotten, those who do not matter in the eyes of the world. He understands human sufferings . . . has bent down to heal body and soul." Entering Jerusalem, Jesus looks at all of us with love, Francis continued, at our sicknesses and sins. "A beautiful scene, full of light--the light of the love of Jesus" (Pope Francis, Palm Sunday homily, March 24, 2013). May this Jubilee Year's Holy Week and Triduum make us Jesus' own light-bearers and love-givers to all who long to see the Face of Mercy.

Catechism Corner

The feast day of St. Joseph is tied to Palm Sunday in many ways. St. Joseph was the first man to "lay down his cloak," welcoming and honoring the Lord by his unwavering support of Mary, pregnant by the Spirit, yet accepting Jesus as his own son. The unborn Jesus first rode on a donkey led by St. Joseph, into Bethlehem. The second time Jesus rode on a donkey was to cheering hosannas from the crowd which we celebrate as Palm Sunday. Those same hosannas were heard at Jesus's birth sung by the angels. St. Joseph honored Jesus all his life, providing for him, teaching him a craft and going without food so that the poor could have his food. It is noteworthy that the wooden cross, on which Jesus died, was also the means by which he earned a living, as taught by his stepfather. In "The Life of Saint Joseph" by Maria Baij, OSB, the mystic reports that Jesus deeply loved Joseph, holding and comforting him at his death. Saint Joseph lived his life hidden in the Divine Light of sacred mysteries. He was himself a living prayer of faith and trust and dedication.

Let us not be like the fickle crowd who praised Jesus one day and turned on Him the next. Let us rather be like St. Joseph who in good times and in bad always praised the Father. "St. Joseph shared with Mary in the same salvific event; he was the guardian of the same love, through the power of which the eternal Father destined us to be his sons through Jesus Christ." El día de San José está ligado al Domingo de Ramos de muchas maneras. San José fue el primer hombre en "dar la capa," acogedor y en honor al Señor por su inquebrantable apoyo a María, embarazada por el Espíritu, sin embargo, aceptar a Jesús como su propio hijo. Jesús montó en un burro dirigido por San José, en Belén. La segunda vez que Jesús montó en un burro fue animando hosannas de la multitud, que celebramos como Domingo de Ramos. Esos mismos hosannas se escucharon en el nacimiento de Jesús cantado por los ángeles. San José honró a Jesús durante toda su vida, proporcionando para él, la enseñanza de un oficio y dejó de comer para que los pobres pudieran tener su comida. Es de destacar que la cruz de madera, en la que murió Jesús, también fue el medio por el cual se ganó la vida, tal como se enseña por su padrastro. En "La Vida de San José" por Maria Baij, OSB, la mística informa que Jesús amaba profundamente a José, que sostiene y lo reconfortante a su muerte. San José vivió su vida oculta en la luz divina de misterios sagrados. Él mismo era una oración viva de la fe y la confianza y dedicación.

No seamos como la multitud voluble que alabó a Jesús un día y se volvió hacia él la próxima. Veamos más bien ser como San José, que en los momentos buenos y en los malos siempre alabó el Padre. "St. José compartió con María en el mismo acontecimiento salvífico; él era el guardián del mismo amor, a través del poder de los que el Padre eterno nos ha destinado a ser sus hijos adoptivos por medio de Jesucristo."
